PROCEDURES FOR COMMUNICATION FOR STUDENTS AND PARENTS FOR ACADEMIC CONCERNS

1. Initial concerns need to be expressed by the student directly to the teacher. We want students to experience and learn direct communication skills that they can carry with them to the next level of their education/career. Additionally, we want to help students learn self-advocacy skills and this is a wonderful opportunity for them to practice these skills.
2. If the issue is not resolved, the parent should contact the individual teacher to arrange a meeting. The student must be present.
3. If you feel the meeting with the teacher did not provide an adequate solution, a meeting involving all parties plus the school counselor and the Director of Educational Support will be arranged.
4. If steps 1-3 have not provided a satisfactory solution, only then should the Principal, Mr. Nick McLaughlin be contacted.

PROCEDURES FOR COMMUNICATION FOR STUDENTS AND PARENTS FOR DISCIPLINE & BULLYING CONCERNS

1. As mentioned above, we want the students to share concerns directly with the Assistant Principal to practice self-advocacy skills.
2. If the issue is not resolved, the parent should contact the Assistant Principal to arrange a meeting.

ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL AND ATHLETIC DIRECTOR'S LETTER

Hello and welcome to St. Bede Academy. It is both an honor and a privilege to serve your child and your family in my role of Assistant Principal and Athletic Director. Contained within this handbook are the essential policies, procedures, and expectations of St. Bede Academy.

The key component contained within these pages is the expectation that all involved with the SBA family conduct themselves as quality citizens which reflect positively on themselves, their families, and our school community.

Regarding student discipline, it is essential to understand that the word "discipline" originates from the Latin word disciplina, meaning "instruction and training." It is derived from the root word discere, or, "to learn." So while "discipline" may seem like it has a negative connotation, in reality it is learning how to make good decisions, or perform correct actions, that lead to positive outcomes both for oneself and for others.

In my role as a school disciplinarian, I will always focus on instructing and modeling those positive choices for your child, while using critical Catholic virtues as reference. While consequences may be assigned, those will be in accordance with the policies and procedures outlined in this handbook.

While any consequences may be, perhaps, "unpleasant", we must always remember that we all generally get ourselves into difficult situations and we are always responsible for our own choices and actions. Knowing that, we must also help our children to take ownership of mistakes and have the fortitude and courage to elevate themselves and challenge one another to make better choices in the future.

Working together, we all will help children grow into responsible, caring, compassionate, and morally just young men and women.

Shifting to athletics, please be advised of the following:

1. Athletic requirements, identified by the IHSA, must be met and satisfied prior to any student participating in organized school activities. This includes but is not solely limited to:
 1. Valid and Doctor signed Sports Physical on file with the Athletic Office.
 2. Properly registering your child for their sport(s) in the Athletic Registration System.
 3. Attending the yearly/seasonal athletic sports meeting.
 4. Ensuring your yearly Athletic Participation Fee has been paid with the business office.
2. There is a proper chain of command regarding any questions regarding your child's participation.
 1. Have your child visit with the head coach.
 2. Then, if needed, please contact the head coach via the method you will receive during the yearly/season sports meeting.
 3. Then, if needed, contact me.
3. Any other program specific rules or policies are the responsibility of that program's head coach and will be communicated with parents during that program's preseason parent meeting. This will be communicated in several ways including but not limited to the Academy's Facebook Page, email and/or text notifications, as well as through the summer programs.

I. CATHOLIC SCHOOL STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

Saint Bede Academy is an independent, Catholic, coeducational secondary school administered by the Benedictines and staffed by both religious and lay people. “From the first moment that a student sets forth in a Catholic school, he or she ought to have the impression of entering a new environment, one illuminated by the light of faith and having its own unique characteristics, an environment permeated with the Gospel spirit of love and freedom.”

Catholic schools exist to transmit the Catholic faith to the young people of the diocese. We welcome non-Catholic students into our schools who wish to take advantage of the opportunities provided by Catholic education. Every school must have as its main goal to help each student develop a personal and ecclesial relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ, who is “the Way, the Truth, and the Life” (John 14:6). The principles, practices, and beliefs of the Catholic Faith must be fully integrated throughout the school’s curricula, service projects, co-curricular activities, and culture.

Students in our Catholic schools are reminded of their dignity as children of God through the study of Catholic doctrine, frequent opportunities for personal and communal prayer, and active participation in the sacramental life of the Church. Together with parents, the primary educators of their children, our Catholic schools pursue academic and spiritual excellence by helping students to develop their intellectual abilities, foster wholesome friendships, practice discipleship, strengthen their daily prayer life, grow in virtue, and become leaders through serving others.

All personnel that work in our Catholic schools must have at heart the promotion of the educational mission of the Church, and live as visible role models of faith within the parish/school community. Catholic doctrinal, moral and social teaching is an integral part of each school. Therefore, all faculty, staff, administrative, and volunteer personnel must support the teachings of the Church, actively practice their faith in daily life, and be loyal to the Church’s Magisterium. Our Catholic school personnel share this educational mission and its various commitments and responsibilities with parents and the local Church communities.

III. MISSION STATEMENT

Saint Bede Academy is a Catholic high school in the Benedictine tradition which endeavors to prepare students for college and for life by welcoming them into a community of learning permeated by Christian values.

IV. LEARNING READINESS

Saint Bede Academy is capable of assisting learners with mild learning limitations which affect learning. Saint Bede is not capable of assisting learners with moderate to severe learning difficulties, or other physical, social, emotional, autism spectrum or psychological disorders which interfere with learning or the educational environment.

V. PARENT’S ROLE IN EDUCATION

We, at Saint Bede Academy, consider it a privilege to work with parents in the education of students because we believe parents are the primary educators of their students. Therefore, it is your right and your duty to become the primary role models for the development of your student’s life—physically, mentally, spiritually, emotionally, and psychologically. Your choice of Saint Bede Academy involves a commitment and exhibits a concern for helping your student to recognize God as the greatest good in his/her life.

Good example is the strongest teacher. Your personal relationship with God, with each other, and with the Church community will affect the way your student relates to God and others. Ideals taught in school are not well rooted in the student unless these are nurtured by the example of good Catholic morality and by an honest personal relationship with God in your family life.

Once you have chosen to enter into a partnership with us at Saint Bede Academy, we trust you will be loyal to this commitment. During these important high school years, your student needs constant support from both parents and faculty in order to develop his/her moral, spiritual, intellectual, social, cultural, and physical endowment. Neither parents nor teachers can afford to doubt the sincerity of the efforts of their educational partner in the quest of challenging, yet nourishing, the student to reach his/her potential. It is vital that both parents and teachers remember that allowing oneself to be caught between the student and the other partner will never have positive results. To divide authority between school and home or within the home will only teach disrespect of all authority. If there is an incident at school, you as parents must make investigation of the complete story your first step. Evidence of mutual respect between parents and teachers will model good mature behavior and relationships.

Students are naturally eager to grow and learn. However, sometimes in the process of maturation new interests may cause them to lose focus. As this natural process occurs, the student needs both understanding and discipline. At times, your student may perceive discipline as restrictive. However, it is boundaries and limits which provide a young person with both guidance and security. It is essential that a student take responsibility for grades he/she has earned and be accountable for homework, long-term assignments, major tests, service projects, and all other assignments. This responsibility also extends to times of absence.

Together, let us begin this year and every year with a commitment to partnership as we support one another in helping your student to become the best person he/she is capable of becoming.

As partners in the educational process at Saint Bede Academy, we ask parents:

- To actively participate in school activities such as Parent/Teacher Conferences.
- To notify the school with a written note when the student has been absent or tardy.
- To notify the school office of any changes of address or important phone numbers.
- To meet all financial obligations to the school.
- To inform the school of any special situation regarding the student's well-being, safety, and health.
- To complete and return to school any requested information promptly.
- To support the religious and educational goals of the school.
- To treat teachers with respect and courtesy in discussing student problems.

VI. STATEMENT OF CORE VALUES

Saint Bede Academy professes the following core values: faith, character, academic excellence, community, stewardship, and justice. We endeavor to practice and to teach them in these ways:

- By deepening and communicating our understanding of the Catholic faith;
- By providing for our students a model of moral and religious character;
- By pursuing excellence in all our academic efforts;
- By exemplifying a community in service to others;
- By practicing responsible stewardship of all God's gifts to us;
- By treating all people with respect and justice.

We believe that, by consistently living according to these values, we will inspire our students to the lifelong practice of a Christian way of life.

VII. EXHORTATION

As a student at Saint Bede, you should experience a feeling of acceptance and belonging – a supportive environment where you can know yourself, love yourself and others. You will be encouraged to develop and contribute your God-given talents, to mature through experiences and relationships. At Saint Bede you deserve respect, but respect is a two-way street: you must in turn respect others – their persons, their property and their ideas. Courtesy, tolerance and charity in your mutual pursuit of truth are highly cherished qualities here. Saint Bede is a community in which all are dependent on one another and responsible for one another's well-being. Within that community, each person is encouraged to grow as a unique and valuable individual, to live and work together effectively, joyfully and peacefully.

Your principal task here is to grow as a whole person – body, mind and spirit, and to become aware that your entire life is a process of returning to the God from whence you came and in whose very image and likeness you were created. During your high school years, a very important part of your return is the growth of the intellect. This development is, of course, the focus of the academic life of the Academy. But as important as the intellect is, you must not neglect the other dimensions of your growth in wisdom and grace. During your years at Saint Bede, you will understand yourself better, your abilities and your limitations, your beliefs and values. You are offered the opportunity to experience the renewing energy that comes from being a part of something larger than yourself, that comes from a feeling of belonging and serving. And most importantly, in everything you do, even in the smallest matter, you are expected to be a person of integrity, honor and compassion.

Saint Bede Academy is a place in which you should take pride, a place which offers you stability and purpose as you progress through life. The extent to which Saint Bede will grow and change while you are here and to which Saint Bede can help you meet your needs will depend largely on your willingness to invest a part of yourself in Saint Bede. You will find that the more you give of yourself to Saint Bede Academy, the more will return to you. In a very real sense, responsibility for helping Saint Bede Academy continue its tradition rests with each of you, from the newest student to the most mature senior.

VIII. CHARACTERISTICS OF A SAINT BEDE GRADUATE

Since 1890, Saint Bede Academy has been providing, "Catholic education in the Benedictine tradition." This tradition is based on the Rule of Saint Benedict and we have chosen to organize our, "Characteristics of a Saint Bede Graduate" around excerpts from this text, a set of regulations Saint Benedict intended as guidelines for a school for the Lord's service.

Clothed then with faith and the performance of good works, let us set out on this way, with the Gospel for our guide.

Upon graduation, Saint Bede students will be grounded in an established, firm Christianity, based on knowledge of scripture, Christian doctrine and Catholic teaching, history and tradition. They will have been expected to use gospel values to evaluate realistic social, moral and political situations. Saint Bede graduates will be familiar with the principles of Benedictine spirituality and the Benedictine way of life. They will have knowledge of and respect for the beliefs and practices of non-Catholic Christians as well as other religious traditions. They will have had regular opportunities to participate in private and communal prayer and will have been given direction in the development of a personal practice of prayer.

Listen carefully, my child, to the master's instructions, and attend to them with the ear of your heart.

Saint Bede graduates will have begun to develop a lifelong commitment to learning. They will have been given opportunities to acquire knowledge in a broad range of areas and to perform tasks requiring higher level thinking skills. Saint Bede graduates will demonstrate the ability to listen attentively, read critically, write and speak clearly and think critically. They will have begun to acquire the ability to articulate opinions, engage in reasoned, factually based discussion and show appropriate respect for the opinions of others.

If we wish to dwell in the tent of this kingdom, we will never arrive unless we run there by doing good deeds.

Saint Bede graduates will have been treated with respect and know how to treat others with respect, warmth and hospitality. They will have an awareness of their place in the world community and of their common bonds with all humans. They will have begun to develop an appreciation of cultures other than their own. They will be aware of their responsibility to be pro-active citizens of their community and will have had the opportunity to participate in service projects both in and out of the local community. They will have considered the moral implications of economic actions, and will have begun to develop a compassion for all people, particularly the poor.

Place your hope in God alone. If you notice something good in yourself, give credit to God, not to yourself, but be certain that the evil you commit is always your own and yours to acknowledge.

Saint Bede graduates will have been given the opportunity to acquire self-knowledge. They will know their dignity as coming from their creation in the image and likeness of God. They will have determined some of their personal strengths and weaknesses, have developed a sense of self-confidence based on this knowledge, and have begun to develop a personal mission statement. They will have been expected to take personal responsibility for their actions and will have experienced both forgiving and being forgiven. They will have been given the opportunity to exercise prudent judgment, apply common sense to a problem, practice humility, and develop a sense of adventure and a sense of humor. They will have begun to acquire a sense of balance in their activities and to develop a lifelong commitment to spiritual, mental and physical fitness.

Your way of acting should be different from the world's way; the love of Christ must come before all else...Never...turn away when someone needs your love.

Saint Bede graduates will realize that the way of the Christian is not necessarily the way of the popular culture. They will have had an opportunity to experience, appreciate and constructively criticize the social, cultural, political and economic opportunities available in both their local area and larger urban settings. As part of the school family, they will have begun to value family at a variety of levels and to develop a sense of loyalty to the various families or communities of which they are members.

They will be aware of their responsibility to be stewards of the earth, showing respect for all living things and will have had practical opportunities to exercise this stewardship. They will have participated in a variety of activities, both academic and extra-curricular, and will have begun to develop a pride in their achievements, and to value working in communion with others. They will have begun to develop a positive work ethic, regarding work as a way in which they cooperate with God's plan of salvation.

Divine Scripture calls to us saying: Whoever exalts himself shall be humbled, and whoever humbles himself shall be exalted.

Saint Bede graduates will have begun to see true humility; not false modesty or low self-esteem, but seeing oneself as God sees. They will have been expected to defer to the needs and wants of others, to take credit and accept proper blame, to follow instructions without grumbling and to accept constructive criticism gratefully. They will have developed the ability to work with others, and will be aware that their behavior has effects for good or ill upon other individuals and upon the whole of their society. Above all, they will have begun to understand that humility demands an acceptance of their dependent relationship to God.

Let them prefer nothing whatever to Christ, and may he bring us all to everlasting life.

IX. GRADUATION OUTCOMES

Before graduation from Saint Bede Academy, a student should have demonstrated the ability to:

- Accurately receive and interpret information and ideas from a variety of oral, written and visual sources.
- Communicate clearly and accurately in oral, written and visual formats for a variety of purposes and audiences.
- Formulate opinions and make decisions consistent with gospel values and Catholic moral and social teaching.
- Demonstrate competency in using the vocabulary and concepts of theology, the arts, humanities, natural and social sciences and mathematics.
- Use critical thinking skills to solve practical and theoretical problems from theology, the arts, humanities, natural and social sciences and mathematics.
- Conduct accurate, efficient research using both traditional and emerging technological methods.
- Make efficient, responsible use of computers and other emerging technology for a variety of purposes.
- Use a language other than English to communicate in a manner that is grammatically and socially correct.
- Recognize and demonstrate connections between academic knowledge, beliefs and actions in everyday life.
- Value and engage in creative expressions through the arts and demonstrate sensitivity to the aesthetic expression of others.
- Work cooperatively with others.
- Demonstrate respect for the person, ideas and belongings of others.
- Recognize and demonstrate the attitudes and activities necessary to maintain spiritual, mental and physical health.

This Handbook only serves to highlight the Academy's general policies, practices, and procedures for your personal benefit and cannot be construed as a legal document of any kind. Any procedure contained within this Handbook is strictly intended to provide all students and parent(s) and/or guardian(s) of students with a general framework for addressing and/or resolving various situations that may arise from time to time. The Academy reserves the right to change, alter, remove and/or amend all procedures, policies, and regulations contained within this Handbook at any time, and at the sole discretion of the Board of Directors, whenever such changes are deemed necessary, and without prior notice or cause. Parent(s) and/or guardian(s) will be given prompt notification of any changes that are made.

XI. STATEMENT OF NON-DISCRIMINATION

No student shall be refused admission, educational policies, scholarships, athletics and any and all other school administered programs on the basis of race, color, gender, national or ethnic origin, religion, or disability (mental and physical). Allegations of discrimination should be reported to the Administration. All allegations of discrimination will be taken seriously and retaliation for reporting discrimination is prohibited. Individuals found to have intentionally made a false report of discrimination may be disciplined.

Saint Bede Academy hopes to provide our students a positive educational environment that develops moral character in conjunction with the teachings of the Benedictines, believing that students must understand the values of diversity and inclusion, and the social conditions of modern America which they will face now in high school, in college in the future, and in life as an adult. It is essential for all of us to work, relate, and be successful together as we pursue the creation and building of a better society for our country by respecting **the dignity of every person; build a Saint Bede Community in which all can flourish; and live in solidarity with all, particularly the most vulnerable.**

Saint Bede Academy aims for a spirit of inclusion, believing that God loves you, as you are, at this moment. Harassment under this policy includes sexual harassment which means any unwelcome sexual advances or requests for sexual favors or any conduct of a sexual nature when:

1. An employee's or Saint Bede Academy agent's unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual or sex-based nature that denies or limits the provision of educational aid, benefits, services or treatment; or that makes such conduct a condition of a student's academic status.
2. Unwelcome sexual advances, requests for favors and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual or sex-based nature by anyone, including students, imposed on the basis of sex, race, color, religion, national or ethnic origin, and disability (mental or physical) that has the purpose or effect of:
 - a. substantially interfering with a student's educational environment;
 - b. creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive educational environment;
 - c. depriving a student of educational aid, benefits, services or treatment,
 - d. making submission to or rejection of such unwelcome conduct the basis for academic decisions affecting a student.

Students who believe they are victims of harassment (race, color, sex, religion, national or ethnic origin, or disability (mental and physical)) are encouraged to report the matter to the Administration. XIII. TUITION AND FEE ADMINISTRATION STANDARDS

2023-2024 TUITION AND FEES

Tuition: \$6,800.00

Registration Fee: \$450.00

Athletic Fee (one fee, per year regardless of # of sports participating in): \$75.00

When enrollment levels at the Academy are set, a belief exists that a student who enrolls in the Academy will be a student at the Academy for the entire year. These enrollment levels are used in many decisions concerning income and expenses for the year. Therefore, the following norms will apply towards tuition and fees:

- 1) Full year tuition and registration fees will be charged to each student account in July each year. An initial invoice will be sent for each student detailing payment methods and options available.
- 2) The registration fee is to be paid prior to or during student registration and is non-refundable. Fees must be paid before a student is allowed to pick up his/her class schedule and books.
- 3) Tuition payment or enrollment in an approved payment plan is due before the first day of school. Students will not be permitted to attend classes until the registration fee and tuition payment agreement has been reached between the parent/guardian and the Academy. Failure to comply with this agreement may result in your student not being allowed to attend classes.
- 4) Tuition agreements will not extend beyond two years to realize full payment on the account. Agreements that are not fulfilled by the parent/guardian will be turned over to a collection attorney and parent/guardian will be responsible for all legal fees and interest.
- 5) Students accepted after the start of the school year will have the tuition and fee calculated according to the following method: If a student enrolls in the first quarter, the student will be charged 100% of tuition and registration fee. Tuition and fee will then be proportioned at 75% of a full year's tuition for enrollment following the first quarter, 50% for enrollment following the second quarter, and 25% for enrollment following the third quarter.
- 6) A refund of tuition only will be granted to students who withdraw within one calendar month from the start of each semester (e.g. one month = August 15 to September 15). The refund granted will be prorated on a per diem basis for the length of enrollment from the first day of the semester. After one calendar month of either semester no refund will be given for that semester's tuition.
- 7) Students who reside within a fifty (50) mile radius of Saint Bede Academy and lives with their parent or legal guardian will be enrolled as a day student. Day students will be charged tuition and fees at the current rate for that school year. Students with a permanent address outside the fifty (50) mile radius or who require an i-20 to attend, and who do not reside with their parent or legal guardian will be considered a boarding student. Boarding students will be charged tuition and fees in conjunction with the boarding program.
- 8) If a student is asked to leave for disciplinary reasons, the right to a refund will be forfeited for the semester.

- 9) If a student moves due to family circumstances and is unable to attend the Academy due to distance or for any other reason besides dissatisfaction with the school, the tuition paid, or owed if unpaid, will be prorated on a per diem basis for the length of enrollment from the first day of school, and a refund will be granted accordingly.
- 10) If a student has a charge on his/her account that is considered a fine (smoking, gum chewing, etc.) or is a charge for lost or damaged Saint Bede property, the tuition refunded will be less the amount of these charges.
- 11) Tuition refunds are given on the amount paid toward the student's account which exceeds the total owed based on the length of student enrollment.
- 12) Failure to satisfy these requirements by their deadlines will place a hold on the release of all grades and transcripts and/or deny the student's admission for the semester following the deadline. For graduating seniors, any balance owed to the Academy must be reconciled prior to graduation day. If it is foreseeable by the parent/guardian that a full payment will not be made by any of the above deadlines, the parent/guardian must contact the Academy.
- 13) When a student withdraws, transfers, graduates or is dismissed, official transcripts will not be released by the Registrar until the tuition balance due at that time has been satisfied. Per Illinois School Code, Section 5/2-3.13a and the 23 Ill. Admin. Code 375.75(i) Saint Bede Academy will only release health records and unofficial transcripts if an unpaid balance exists at the time of withdrawal, transfer, graduation or dismissal. In some cases this may result in holding the transcript until the payment agreement has been fulfilled or a payoff of the remaining balance has been made.
- 14) In the case of death of a student, a tuition refund will be calculated on a per diem basis for the length of attendance from the first day of school of the semester.
- 15) Students of Saint Bede Academy who experience the death of a parent who was the primary financial support of the household will have their tuition for the remainder of their years/semesters at Saint Bede paid for from the Memorial Tuition Fund established and funded by the Academy for this sole purpose. Please contact the Superintendent or Business Office should you qualify to access this support.
- 16) Any situation not specifically covered under the above guidelines shall be handled at the discretion of the Academy administration.
- 17) Enforcement of the guidelines will be handled between the Superintendent and the office of the Treasurer, neither of whom has full authority to grant clemency in a situation. While extenuating circumstances may come about in certain family situations, enforcement of the Tuition and Fee Administration Standards will only be suspended with full consent of both the Superintendent and the office of the Treasurer.

D. ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE

The main administrative office is open each school day from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. All school business should be conducted during these hours. During the summer the office is open Monday through Thursday from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

E. APPEAL AND REVIEW POLICY

A review or appeal of any decision concerning policies, procedures, or other serious matters made by the competent authority of Saint Bede Academy may be requested by any parent/guardian of any present student or pastor of a supporting parish under the following conditions only:

- *The decision violates or is in conflict with the teachings of the Roman Catholic Church, or*
- *The decision violates or is in conflict with a policy or procedure of Saint Bede Academy, or other entity that takes precedence over the decision in question, or*
- **The decision violates or is in conflict with an applicable federal, state or local civil law.**

It is to be noted that dissatisfaction with a decision is not a sufficient condition of appeal. Anyone interested in reviewing the accompanying Administrative Regulations, that support the implementation of this policy, may do so by accessing the Saint Bede Academy website, www.st-bede.com. You may also request a copy of the Administrative Regulations through the Principal's office.

F. BUSINESS OFFICE

The business office is open Monday - Friday from 7:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

G. IDENTIFICATION

A student identification card is used at Saint Bede Academy. All students are required to carry their ID card. Students must show their ID card upon request to all authorized persons including cafeteria personnel, maintenance personnel, school bus drivers or other authorized persons. Student ID cards are used to gain admission to activities sponsored by Saint Bede and for gaining admission at student price to activities sponsored by other high schools.

H. DAILY ANNOUNCEMENTS

Announcements are made each day during homeroom. A copy of the day's announcements is posted on the main bulletin board. Special announcements may be made during the school day. All announcements are to be presented, in writing, to the school secretary by 7:45 a.m.

I. BULLETIN BOARD

It is the responsibility of each student daily to check the main bulletin board. Students who wish to exhibit posters or signs must have the authorization of the administration to use the first floor bulletin board.

J. EMERGENCY CLOSING

Parents and students are encouraged to sign-up for BCR Alerts. BCR Alerts will be used to notify parents and students of emergency closings and school and event cancellations. In the event of an emergency, cancellation or closing the radio station WLPO/WAJK (AM 1220/FM99.3) will also be notified. PLEASE DO NOT CALL THE SCHOOL FOR CONFIRMATION OF THE SCHOOL'S CLOSING.

K. MESSAGES FOR STUDENTS

The school is NOT to be expected to relay messages from home or place of work to individual students. ONLY IN EMERGENCIES should parents feel free to call.

L. CELLULAR PHONES/AIRPODS-HEAD PHONES/SMARTWATCHES

The telephones in administrative offices are not available for students except when permission is granted.

- Students are not permitted to have cellular telephones and smart watches on their person during the school day. Cellular telephones and smart watches must be stored in student lockers and turned **OFF** during the school day. If a student is caught using their phone, disciplinary action will be taken.
- AirPods are not allowed in the corridors, refectory, or academic areas. A teacher may grant the use of headphones/AirPods in their classrooms at certain times.
- Parents/Guardians or coaches cannot call or text their student via their device(s) during the school day. Every student has a Saint Bede email account which should be used in place of the device(s), and parents/guardians or coaches can contact the main office to connect with a student. Each student and their parent(s)/guardian(s) will be required to sign an agreement and liability waiver which, in short, will state their agreement with the cell phone policy.

Cell phone / Smartwatch / Headphone or Earbuds Discipline

Discipline 0: Verbal warning from teacher

Discipline 1: 2 Weekday detention and phone will be turned in daily to the Assistant Principal for no longer than five consecutive student attendance days.

Discipline 2: Saturday morning detention, \$10 fine, and phone will be turned in daily to the Assistant Principal for no longer than ten consecutive student attendance days.

Discipline 3: 1-week disciplinary probation (i.e. extracurriculars) & 2 Saturday detentions, \$10 fine for each Saturday School, phone will be turned in daily to the Assistant Principal for no longer than twenty consecutive student attendance days.

Discipline 4: 1-month disciplinary probation, 3 Saturday detentions, phone will be turned in daily to the Assistant Principal for the remainder of the school year.

Beyond, \$10 fine for each Saturday School, : repeat step 4

Theft of device (whether for joke or not) Discipline

Discipline 1: 3-day out-of-school suspension

Discipline 2: Liable to dismissal

M. TEXTBOOKS

Books are rented and must be returned at the end of the year. Some textbooks are supplied by the State of Illinois and parents must sign a form requesting these books. (A sample of this form is found on the student registration sheet.) Charges will be made for all damaged and/or lost books.

N. COLLECTIONS

All collections or selling of merchandise by students or student organizations, for whatever reason, is prohibited without prior permission of the Administration.

O. WORK PERMITS

Work permits for students under 16 years of age may be obtained in the school's main administrative office. A student must have secured a job before applying for a work permit.

P. VISITORS

A student may invite a guest to visit the school during class hours only if the guest is a prospective Saint Bede student. Student visitors must be approved by the Director of Admissions at least one day prior to the visit. All guests of the Academy must receive an admittance slip from the Director of Admissions. The visitor will not be allowed into the classrooms without such an admittance slip.

XV. ACADEMIC LIFE

A. COURSE OF STUDIES

The Academy COURSE DESCRIPTION BOOK contains a complete listing and description of all courses offered at Saint Bede Academy.

B. CLASS LOAD

The school day consists of eight (8) periods. All students must take seven (7) courses per semester and will have one (1) study hall.

Students are required to complete 25 hours of Christian service per academic year.

Saint Bede Academy is a Catholic, college preparatory high school. While we understand that not all of our students plan to attend a post-secondary school when they start high school, we do require that all of our students fulfill the requirements in case they should decide to do so later. This means that students will be required to take standardized tests administered at Saint Bede Academy as assigned. This includes but is not limited to the PSAT 8/9, PSAT10, PSAT-NMSQT, SAT and/or the ACT while enrolled at Saint Bede Academy. The costs of most of these tests will be included in the student's tuition and fees.

D. CHRISTIAN SERVICE PROGRAM

Students are required to complete 25 hours of Christian service per academic year. If a student transfers to Saint Bede Academy, the number of service hours is prorated based on the years of enrollment. Christian Service projects may be completed during the school year and/or the summer (after ninth grade). Seniors must complete all Christian Service requirements by May 1 to be eligible to participate in graduation and earn a diploma.

Christian Service projects must be approved prior to the student beginning the project.

Senior transcripts and diplomas are held until the student has met all Christian Service requirements.

F. PROGRESS AND REPORT CARDS

Each semester a progress report and a semester report card will be made available in the student's e-Portfolio (via the e-Locker) in their Rediker Plus Portal Account. Progress reports will be available at the conclusion of the first and third grading periods. Report cards are available at the conclusion of the first and second semesters.

G. REDIKER PLUS PORTALS

Rediker Plus Portals is Saint Bede Academy's online grade, homework reporting, and classroom information system. Students and parents will be provided with information to access this system at the beginning of each school year. Parents are encouraged to visit this site to monitor their student's progress throughout the school year.

H. GRADE POINT AVERAGE, CLASS RANK, HONOR ROLL

Grade point average in regular classes is computed on the basis of A = 4 points, B = 3 points, C = 2 points and D = 1 point. In honors/Advanced Placement classes, A = 5 points, B = 4 points, C = 3 points and D = 2 points. The grade point average is the total number of points divided by the number of classes the student is taking for that grading period. Class rank is determined by the cumulative grade point average for the number of semesters the student has completed. The valedictorian, salutatorian and other eight members of the top ten in the senior class are determined by the student's grade point average at the end of the first semester of the senior year. The honor roll is issued at the end of the first and third quarters and at the end of the first and second semesters. To be listed on the honor roll, a student must have a grade point average of 3.0 on a scale of 4.0 and may not have received any grades of D, F or I for that grading period. Students withdrawing from a class will receive a WF (withdraw failure) or WP (withdraw pass). The student will receive a WF or WP depending on their grade at the time of the withdrawal.

I. CHEATING AND PLAGIARISM

Saint Bede Academic believes in the importance of honesty and integrity within our academic community. Saint Bede expects all students to maintain the highest standards in academic work. Intellectual honesty is at the heart of any academic undertaking. Cheating is dishonest, degrades character and reputation, and impedes individual learning.

Intellectual honesty is at the heart of any academic undertaking. Cheating/plagiarism is dishonest, degrades character and reputation, and impedes on individual learning.

All work submitted for credit in any class at Saint Bede is expected to be the original work of the student submitting it. If work is not the original effort of the student, that student may be found guilty of cheating and/or plagiarism.

Cheating occurs by some but not all examples of cheating are listed below:

- Obtaining a copy of a test or scoring device.
- Accepting a copy of a test or scoring device.
- Copying another student's answers during an examination.
- Providing another student answers or copies of examination questions.
- Using notes or other non-acceptable materials during "closed-book" examinations.
- Duplicating another student's work for submission as one's own work.
- Having someone other than the student prepares the student's homework, project, reports, or take-home examinations for which credit is taken.
- Permitting another student to copy the student's homework, paper, project, computer program, lab report, or take-home examination other than for a teacher approved collaborative effort.
- Any other action to obtain credit or work not one's own.
- Using the computer to copy or put one's name on another student's work.
- Using Artificial Intelligence to write your paper.

Cheating and plagiarism constitute deliberate acts of deception. A student found guilty of cheating and/or plagiarism shall receive a zero "F" for the assignment/exercise and makeup privileges will not be granted. If repeated actions occur, disciplinary action will be taken in addition to the zero-credit earned at the discretion of the administration.

J. COURSE SELECTION AND ACADEMIC LEVEL PLACEMENT

Students are placed in courses by parent/student choice and academic levels (academic, college prep and honors/Advanced Placement) by teacher recommendation. Teacher recommendations are based on grades, previous placement, classroom observation and consultation with other faculty. If the parent/student questions the teacher recommendation, the parents may ask to meet with the Director of Guidance, the teacher making the recommendation and the department head for that area to determine the best course and/or level for the student. If a mutual decision cannot be reached, the parent may contact the Principal who will consider the parent/student's choice, the teacher's recommendation, grades in previous courses, grade point average and previous placement in determining a schedule. The Principal will inform all parties of his/her decision. If the parents disagree with the placement, a meeting with the Superintendent may be arranged and his decision will be final.

K. TRANSFER STUDENTS

Requests to enroll as a transfer student are determined on an individual basis. Transfers after a student has completed six academic semesters are unlikely. A student must be enrolled a minimum of three (3) semesters at Saint Bede Academy to be eligible to be considered Valedictorian or Salutatorian of the Senior Class. Students transferring to Saint Bede Academy may be placed on academic, social and disciplinary probation.

L. SCHEDULE CHANGES

- **A student can drop a class and replace it with a different class within the first 5 days of the course's start date.**
- **A student cannot change to a different section of the same course.**
- Changes are not made because a student does not like a particular course or teacher.
- Changes after the first 5 days of a semester are made only after approval by the Principal, School Counselor, parents and teachers involved. Changes initiated by the teacher may be made until the end of the first grading period of each semester.
- A student earning a grade of "D" or lower in an honor's class may be considered for course rescheduling beyond the ordinary scheduling constraints.
- Schedule changes initiated by the student are generally not allowed.
- The fee for a schedule change is \$10.00.

M. HOMEWORK

Homework is generally given in all classes. It is the responsibility of the student to complete all assigned work. Parents should encourage their child to complete all assignments and assist their child as needed.

N. INCOMPLETE GRADES

An incomplete (I) may be given on a report card when, as a result of extenuating circumstances, some required work or exams for a course has not been completed. A student is to make up the work within three (3) weeks of the end of the grading period or it becomes a failure (F). It is the responsibility of the student, not the teacher, to initiate arrangements to complete class requirements. In extenuating circumstances, such as a long illness, approval must be obtained from the Principal to go beyond the three-week make-up period.

O. FAILED COURSES

Students who receive a failing grade (F) for a required course (example: U.S. History) must make up that course by some means, i.e. summer school, correspondence course, or (whenever possible) rescheduling the class at the Academy for the following semester or school year. Depending upon the course and/or the school schedule, retaking a course may restrict the student's options regarding study halls, Area Career Center, and electives and will not remove a student from academic probation.

P. RECORDS

The 1975 Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (Buckley Amendment) gives parents and students the right of access to records. If a parent or student wishes to view the student's personal records, then he or she must make a written request to the administration at least 24 hours in advance. Saint Bede Academy abides by the provisions of the Buckley Amendment with respect to the rights of non-custodial parents. In the absence of a court order to the contrary, the school will provide the non-custodial parent with access to the academic records and to other school related information regarding the child. If there is a court order specifying that no information be given, it is the responsibility of the custodial parent to provide the school with an official copy of the court order. A copy of the child's report card and other school-related information will be sent to the non-custodial parent only upon written request by the non-custodial parent, provided that no court order to the contrary has been issued and received by the school.

Q. MISSING CHILDREN'S RECORD ACT

Upon notification by the Illinois State Police Department of a person's disappearance, Saint Bede Academy shall flag the record of that person in such a manner that whenever a copy of or information regarding the record is requested, the school or other entity shall be alerted to the fact that the record is that of a missing person. Saint Bede Academy shall immediately report to the Illinois State Police Department any request concerning flagged records or knowledge as to the whereabouts of any missing person. Upon notification by the Illinois State Police Department that the missing person has been recovered, Saint Bede Academy shall remove the flag from the person's record. (325 ILCS 50/5) (from Ch. 23, par. 2285)

R. TRANSCRIPTS

A transcript is the official record of a student's course and grades. All senior transcript requests must be submitted to www.parchment.com. No transcript is sent if the student has an unsatisfied financial obligation to the school. Alumni must request their transcript through www.parchment.com or using the transcript request form from the school's website.

S. ACADEMIC PROBATION AND RETENTION

Any student who earned two (2) or more failing grades at the end of a semester is automatically placed on academic probation. Academic probation extends through the next consecutive semester. Academic probation does not change if a student elects to take and pass a credit recovery course.

- **Any student who earned two (2) failing grades at the end of the semester has met the minimum standard set forth by the Illinois High School Association (IHSA) to participate in interscholastic activities. These students will be allowed to participate and attend practices and games, as well as attend social events, dramatic performances, etc. provided there are no failing grades on the student's eligibility report**
- **An eligibility report is generated every Monday at 10:00 am following the first full week of instruction each semester.**
- **If a student earns a failing grade while on academic probation (in any course) on a weekly eligibility verification, they will not be allowed to attend or participate in games, but will be able to practice. In addition, they will not be able to attend social events, dramatic performances, etc.**

Any student who earned three (3) failing grades at the end semester has not met the minimum standard set forth by the IHSA to participate in any interscholastic activities. These students will not be allowed to participate (including practices) in any sport for that semester.

However, if they maintain a status of no failing grades following the first eligibility verification of semester, they will be allowed to participate in Saint Bede clubs and activities and attend sporting events as spectators.

When a student is placed on academic probation, the student will receive a letter from the principal that explains this policy and warns the student of dismissal from the academy if they earn two (2) or more failing grades at the end of the subsequent semester.

Students who transfer from Saint Bede Academy, due to dismissal based on academic probation, will not be permitted to reapply to the academy for a period of one (1) academic year. Any student who receives five (5) or more failing grades in any given semester is liable for dismissal.

T. POLICY ON ALL EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

All athletic and other extracurricular programs have rules and regulations concerning violations of school policy. Students must be passing six subjects when enrolled in seven Saint Bede Academy classes and five subjects when enrolled in an E²C class during any week that the Eligibility Verification or report cards are issued. If he or she is academically ineligible, they will be suspended for one week of activities or athletics events beginning immediately and ending on the following Monday. The student will attend meetings, rehearsals and/or practices. **If a student is ineligible for three consecutive weeks as determined by the weekly Eligibility Verification the student may be removed from the team.** If a student is suspended for violation of school rules and regulations, he or she will be suspended for a one-week period of activities or athletic events for each day of suspension. The student will not participate in practice on days they are suspended. Students must be in attendance for a full school day to participate in practice or events unless excused by administration. Students must be in attendance for four class periods to attend practice or events. **Students must be in school on Friday to participate in a weekend event.**

U. PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

During the first ten weeks of the first semester, conferences will be held for the parents of all students. Parents may always schedule a conference with an individual teacher and should contact that teacher directly. Conferences with more than one teacher may be arranged through the Director of Guidance.

V. CONDUCT IN THE CORRIDORS/CLASSROOM/REFECTORY

Students are always expected to conduct themselves properly. School corridors are designed to accommodate an orderly flow of student traffic between classrooms. Running in the corridors or congregating in groups is prohibited. Students are not to sit on the floors or stairs since this presents a health and safety hazard. Having radios, walkie-talkies, laser pointers, or cellphones in the classroom, corridors, or refectory is forbidden.

- Public demonstration of affection (holding hands, embracing, kissing) is always in poor taste and not appropriate behavior in school.
- Food of any kind (pop, cand, etc.) is not to be consumed in the corridors or classrooms. However, water bottles will be permitted in the corridors and in classrooms at the teacher's discretion. Students are not to be in the corridors during class time unless they have a pass and the school date book.
- Students who persist in inappropriate conduct will be reported to the Assistant Principal's office for disciplinary action.

W. DANCE POLICY

There are many special dances sponsored by various organizations in the school.

These dances are held for the enjoyment of all Saint Bede Academy students. The following guidelines will be followed with regards to dances.

- No one 21 years of age or older will be admitted.
- No junior high school student will be admitted.
- Saint Bede students can bring a non-Saint Bede guest to Homecoming, Turnabout, and Prom. The Saint Bede student must register their date with the administration and have their date complete and return the appropriate form on the required day preceding the dance.
- Students scheduled for Saturday School the day of a dance must serve Saturday School in order to attend the dance that evening unless they have a rollover to use.
- ID cards are required in addition to the admission fee. No student will be admitted without a valid ID card.
- Students will remain in the dance area until they are ready to leave and will not be readmitted if they leave.
- Timelines for admittance to the dances, typically 30-60 minutes, will be restricted according to the dance. Students will be reminded of the time frame in which they must arrive for each dance. Most evening dances begin at 7:00 p.m. and end at 10:00 p.m. or earlier.
- All school rules are in effect during dances including the prohibition of tobacco, alcohol, and other drugs.
- For a student to attend a dance, he/she must be in attendance by 10:00 am of the day of the dance or if there is no school by 10:00 am of the previous school day and remain in attendance until the end of the day.
- Students are discouraged from scheduling elective medical appointments the day of or the day prior to a dance if it is a non-school day because if a student is not in school by 10:00 am, he/she will not be admitted.
- The principal may make exceptions, but this will only be done in rare cases where extenuating circumstances are evident.
- The Saint Bede administration has the right not to admit any student who is not in good standing. Homecoming, Turnabout, and Prom guests must be pre-approved and in good standing. Saint Bede administration has the right and responsibility to exclude any student or guest from attending a dance if it believes that this individual poses a safety risk or is disruptive to the educational environment.
- Cars must be parked in the parking lot.
- The school building and grounds are off limits.

Saint Bede Academy students and their guests will be required to take a Breathalyzer test before entering a dance. Any student refusing to take the Breathalyzer test will not be permitted to enter. If a student fails the test, the student's parents will be contacted immediately and will be required to provide immediate transportation from the dance.

X. FINAL EXAMS

- If a student doesn't show up for final exams and no contact has been made with the main office, the student will receive a zero on the final exam.
- If a student is sick and contact with the main office has been made, the student will receive an incomplete until they can complete the final exams. Students will be expected to complete their final exams on the day school returns from Christmas break for Fall Semester Exams and the next week day for Spring Final Exams.
- Families should make every effort to refrain from scheduling vacations during final exams and accommodations are up to the discretion of the Principal.

Y. 1:1 GOOGLE CHROMEBOOK INITIATIVE

1. Program Goal

The goal of the 1:1 Google Chromebook program at Saint Bede Academy is to create a learning environment that is consistent with advances in technology and facilitates resource sharing, critical thinking, innovation, research, creativity, communication, collaboration, increased productivity and mobile learning.

2. What is a Google Chromebook?

A Google Chromebook is a personal computer running Google Chrome OS as its operating system. Chromebooks are designed to be used while connected to the Internet and support applications like Google Docs that reside on the Web, rather than traditional PC applications like Microsoft Office and Photoshop that reside on the machine itself. This allows the Chromebook to be sold at a much lower price point than traditional laptops.

3. Receiving Your Chromebook

The following must be completed before receiving your Chromebook:

- a. Parents and students must sign and return the Acceptable Use Policy and Saint Bede Academy 1:1 Student/Parent Google Chromebook Agreement (see attached appendices)
- b. Chromebooks will be distributed at the start of the school year. All consent forms must be turned in prior to distribution.

4. Training

Students will be provided with a brief overview of how to log in to the device and access Google Drive and their Saint Bede Google Apps for Education accounts.

5. Return

If requested by the Technology Department, students may be required to turn in their Chromebooks for maintenance or inspection. Upon graduating from Saint Bede, students will assume full responsibility of his or her Chromebook. Any student who transfers, withdraws, or is expelled from Saint Bede Academy prior to graduation will be required to return his/her Chromebook and accessories upon termination of enrollment. The Chromebook and accessories must be in good working order when returned. If the Chromebook and accessories are not returned, the parent/guardian will be held responsible for payment in full.

6. Acceptable Use of Chromebook

a. *at School*

The Chromebook is intended for use at school each and every day. In addition to teacher expectations for Chromebook use, students may be asked to access school messages, announcements, calendars, handbooks, and grades using their Chromebooks. Students are responsible for bringing their Chromebooks to all classes, unless specifically advised not to do so by their teacher. While in class, students are expected to comply with all school rules, policies, and teacher directives when using their Chromebooks.

b. *Loaner Chromebooks*

If a student leaves the Chromebook at home, he/she is responsible for getting the coursework completed as if the Chromebook were present. A limited number of loaner Chromebooks may be issued to students who forget to bring their Chromebooks to school for a \$10.00 per day fee. A limited number of "loaner" Chromebooks are available so a loaner cannot be guaranteed. Loaners must be returned to the Technology Department by 3 p.m., at the end of the school day.

*note: Loaner Chromebooks may be issued to students when their school-issued Chromebooks are being repaired at no charge. Students may keep the loaner until his or her Chromebook has been repaired.

c. *at Home*

Students are encouraged to use their Chromebooks at home and other locations outside of school. A Wi-Fi Internet connection will be required for the majority of Chromebook use. However, some applications can be used while not connected to the Internet. Students are bound by the *Saint Bede Academy Acceptable Use Policy* and all rules of this guide regardless of where they use their Chromebooks and regardless of the source of the Internet connection.

d. **Sound**

Sound must be muted at all times during school hours unless permission is obtained from the teacher for instructional purposes.

e. **Printing**

At school: At this time printing from a Chromebook will not be available at school. Printing **is not** available from non-Chromebook school computers. When possible, teachers will facilitate digital assignments.

At home: The Chromebook will not support a physical printer connection. Instead, users may print to their home printers using the Google Cloud Print service. A wireless home network is required for this. Please see <http://support.google.com/cloudprint> for more details.

f. **Camera**

The camera may be used for school purposes only. Any misuse of the Chromebook camera may result in disciplinary action.

7. **Managing Your Files and Saving Your Work**

Students are encouraged to save files to their Google Drive account. Saving to Google Drive will make the file accessible from any computer with internet access. Some files may be stored on the Chromebooks hard drive. Students should always remember to save frequently when working on digital media. The school will not be responsible for the loss of any student work. Students are encouraged to maintain backups of important work.

8. **Taking Care of Your Chromebook**

Students are responsible for the general care of the Chromebook they have been issued.

Chromebooks that are broken or fail to work properly must be immediately taken to the Technology Department and logged for repair. If the Technology Coordinator is unable to repair the broken Chromebook, the parent(s) must assume responsibility for its repair.

9. **General Precautions**

- No food or drink should be placed next to the Chromebook.
- Cords, cables, and removable storage devices must be inserted carefully into the Chromebook.
- Heavy objects should never be placed on top of Chromebooks.
- Chromebooks should never be exposed to extreme temperatures or direct sunlight for extended periods of time.
- Chromebooks should never be carried with the screen open.
- A police report will be filed in case of theft or damage caused by fire.
- Students should never disassemble Chromebooks and attempt their own repairs.
- Chromebooks must be stored in their closed cases at all times in the locker room or restroom.

10. **Cases**

Students must use a protective case for their Chromebooks at all times. Although the cases are reinforced to help protect the Chromebooks, they are not guaranteed to prevent damage. It remains the student's responsibility to care for and protect his/her device.

11. **Charging**

Chromebooks must be brought to school each day in **fully charged** condition.

Each Chromebook will include an AC adapter. This adapter should be used to charge the Chromebooks at home. Students will be permitted to charge Chromebooks in the classroom at the teacher's discretion or in the Technology Lab.

12. **Screen Care**

The Chromebook screen can be damaged if subjected to heavy objects, rough treatment, certain cleaning solvents, and other liquids. The screens are particularly sensitive to damage from excessive pressure.

- Do not put pressure on the top of a Chromebook when it is closed.
- Do not store a Chromebook with the screen open.
- Do not place anything in the protective case that will press against the cover.
- Make sure there is nothing on the keyboard before closing the lid.
- Only clean the screen with a soft, dry microfiber cloth or anti-static cloth.

13. **Identification Tags**

All Chromebooks will be labeled with an identification tag. Identification tags may not be modified or tampered with in any way while the student is enrolled in Saint Bede Academy.

14. Storing Your Chromebook

Though students should have their Chromebooks at all times, there may be times when students are not monitoring their Chromebooks. In these rare cases, they should be stored in students' lockers with the locks securely fastened. Nothing should be placed on top of the Chromebook when stored in a locker.

Chromebooks should never be stored in a vehicle. Students are responsible for securely storing their Chromebook during extra-curricular activities and events.

Under no circumstances should a Chromebook be stored in unsupervised areas. Unsupervised areas might include the school grounds and campus, the refectory, unlocked classrooms, unlocked lockers, the library, locker rooms, dressing rooms, hallways, bathrooms, in a car, or any other area that is not securely locked or in which there is no supervision.

Unsupervised Chromebooks will be confiscated by staff and taken to the Technology Office. The school is not responsible for the safekeeping and protection of Chromebooks.

15. Software and Security

All Chromebooks are supplied with the latest build of Google Chrome Operating System (Chrome OS) and many other applications useful in an educational environment. The Chrome OS will automatically install updates when the computer is shut down and restarted.

Students are prohibited from disabling, modifying, circumventing or altering management settings or content filters.

16. Virus Protection

Because virus protection is built into the Chrome OS, additional virus protection software is unnecessary.

17. Content Filter

Saint Bede Academy utilizes an Internet content filter that is in compliance with the federally mandated Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA). Despite the filter, the school cannot guarantee that all controversial or inappropriate materials will be blocked.

18. Google Apps for Education

Chromebooks seamlessly integrate with the Google Apps for Education suite of productivity and collaboration tools. This suite includes Google Docs, Spreadsheets, Presentations, Drawings, and Forms. All work is stored in the cloud.

19. Chrome Web Apps and Extensions

Students are allowed to install appropriate Chrome web apps and extensions from the Chrome Web Store. Inappropriate material will result in disciplinary action.

20. Personalizing Your Chromebook

- a. Students may add applications, music, photos, and videos to their Chromebook.

Personalized media are subject to inspection and must follow the Saint Bede Academy Acceptable Use Policy.

- b. Students are not permitted to decorate the exterior of their Chromebooks. Students may decorate the Chromebook cases only if they wish. In the event of a lost or stolen case, students must purchase another case.

21. No Expectation of Privacy

Although the content of the device is not routinely monitored, students have no expectation of confidentiality or privacy with respect to the usage or content of a school-issued Chromebook, regardless of whether that use is for school-related or personal purposes, other than as specifically provided by law. Saint Bede reserves the right to monitor or access the hard drives of these devices if it suspects or is advised of possible breaches of security, harassment, or other violations of other school policies, rules, regulations, directives, or law, or evidence exists which demonstrates to the school that this device may contain information, data, or other intellectual property that belongs to another person. Chromebooks are subject to confiscation at any time and without prior notice. By using a Chromebook, students agree to such access, monitoring, and recording of their use.

22. Liability

- a. Students are responsible for all material sent by and/or stored on the device assigned to them. Students accept responsibility for keeping his or her device free of pornographic material, inappropriate test files, or files that may compromise the integrity of Saint Bede Academy's network, equipment, or software.
- b. Saint Bede Academy is not liable for any material sent by and/or stored on the device.

23. Warranty

a. Vendor Warranty

Chromebooks include a three year hardware warranty from the vendor.

The vendor warrants the Chromebook from defects in materials and workmanship.

24. Replacement Costs & Repair Procedures

a. *Repair Procedure*

Students who need to have their Chromebooks repaired or replaced should fill out the Repair Report Form and leave the device with the Technology Coordinator. The Technology Coordinator will document the issue. The Technology Coordinator will collect the device for repair.

b. *Loaner Chromebooks*

If one is available, a loaner Chromebook will be issued to the student. If repair is needed due to malicious damage, the school may refuse to provide a loaner or refuse to reissue a Chromebook. While students are enrolled at Saint Bede Academy, loaner Chromebook devices issued are the property of the school. Any damage to a loaner Chromebook will be the responsibility of the parent(s).

c. *After Repair*

Students will be notified by the Technology Integration Specialist when their Chromebook has been repaired. Repaired Chromebooks can be picked up at the Technology Department. A repaired Chromebook may need to be restored to its original settings. Locally stored files may not be able to be recovered.

d. *Lost or Stolen Devices*

Students who have lost or had his or her Chromebook stolen must fill out a Lost/Stolen Device Reporting Form and return to the Technology Coordinator. While students are enrolled at Saint Bede Academy, Chromebook devices issued are the property of Saint Bede Academy. **Should the student lose or have his or her Chromebook stolen, he or she is liable for the replacement cost of the device. Students have no ownership, interest, or right to title the device.**

25. Digital Citizenship

School-issued Chromebooks should be used for educational purposes and students must adhere to the Saint Bede Academy Acceptable Use Policy as well as related policies and procedures at all times when using Chromebooks, on or off campus.

While working in a digital and collaborative environment, students should always conduct themselves as good digital citizens by adhering to the following:

1. **Respect Yourself** – Show respect through your actions. Select online names that are appropriate. Use caution with the information, images, and other media that is posted online. Carefully consider the personal information you share about yourself.
2. **Protect Yourself** – Ensure that the information, images, and materials posted online will not put you at risk. Do not publish personal details, contact details, or personal activity schedules. Immediately report any inappropriate behavior directed at you while online. Protect your passwords, accounts, and resources. Never share this information with others.
3. **Respect Others** – Show respect to others. Do not use electronic mediums to antagonize, bully, harass, or stalk people.
4. **Protect Others** – Protect others by reporting abuse and not forwarding inappropriate materials or communications. Avoid unacceptable materials and conversations.
5. **Respect Intellectual Property** – Request permission to use copyrighted or otherwise protected materials. Properly cite the use of websites, books, media, etc.
6. **Protect Intellectual Property** – Do not use pirated software or distribute music or media in a manner that violates license agreements.

26. Indemnification

By signing the Saint Bede Academy 1:1 Student/Parent Google Chromebook Agreement, the students and his or her parent(s) or guardian(s) agree to reimburse and hold the school harmless from and against any and all liabilities, costs, collection costs, attorney fees, and other damages which arise out of or relate in any way to the use of the device and its software to the school in accordance with this policy. Saint Bede reserves the right to change this policy at any time. Please refer to our handbook and/or our website for the most current policies.

Z. ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY FOR COMPUTER, TELECOMMUNICATIONS, ETC

Computing, data storage, and information retrieval systems are designed to serve the students, faculty, staff, and volunteers of the Academy community. Network and Internet access is provided to further the legitimate educational goals of this institution. The Academy provides computing and network resources for the use of students, employees, and others affiliated with the Academy. Members of the Academy community are encouraged to use computers, software packages, electronic mail (E-mail), or outside the Academy network software for educational or Academy related activities and to facilitate the efficient exchange of useful information. However, the equipment, software, and network capacities provided through the Academy computer services are and remain the property of the Academy. All users are expected to conduct their on-line activities in an ethical and legal fashion. The Academy prohibits the use of e-mail, voicemail, the Internet and computer systems in any way (including but not limited to, accessing, downloading, creating, or transmitting) and any kind of information or communication whatsoever (including but not limited to all writings of any kind, websites, photographs, pictures, and computer print-outs), which is, without limitation, discriminatory, harassing, retaliatory, insulting, derogatory, offensive, demeaning, hostile or negative in any manner whatsoever to people on the basis race, color, religion, national origin, ethnicity, ancestry, military status, sex, pregnancy, sexual orientation, disability (mental or physical), age, marital status, citizenship status, unfavorable military discharge, genetic information, order of protection status, arrest or criminal history record information ordered expunged, sealed, or impounded, and any other protected status. The use of these resources is a privilege, not a right. Misuse of these resources will result in the suspension or loss of these privileges, as well as disciplinary, legal, and/or monetary consequences.

Saint Bede Academy may not request or require a password or other related account information in order to gain access to a student's account or profile on a social networking website.

Saint Bede Academy may conduct an investigation or require a student to cooperate in an investigation if there is sufficient evidence to suggest the student's social network account violates the school's disciplinary policy; and, Saint Bede Academy may require the student to share content in the course of an investigation.

Appropriate or acceptable educational uses of these resources include:

1. Accessing the Internet to retrieve information from libraries, databases and World Wide Web sites to enrich and expand curriculum is encouraged.
2. E-mail capabilities may be used to facilitate distance learning projects.
3. Listservs and newsgroups may be used to gain access to current information on local, state, national and world events.

Examples of inappropriate or unacceptable use(s) of these resources include, but are not limited to, those uses that violate the law, the rules of network etiquette, or hamper the integrity or security of any network connected to the Internet. Some unacceptable practices include but are not limited to:

1. Transmission of any material in violation of any United States or state law, including but not limited to: copyrighted material; threatening, harassing, pornographic, or obscene material; or material protected by trade secret is prohibited. The transmission of copyrighted materials without the written permission of the author or creator through E-mail or other network resources in violation of United States copyright law is prohibited. As with all forms of communication, E-mail or other network resources may not be used in a manner that is disruptive to the work or educational environment. The display or transmission of messages, images, cartoons or the transmission or use of E-mail or other computer messages that are sexually explicit constitute harassment which is prohibited by the Academy. It is also illegal for anyone to knowingly allow any telecommunications facility under their control to be used for the transmission of illegal material.
2. The use for personal, financial or commercial gain, product advertisement, political lobbying or the sending of unsolicited junk mail, or chain letters is prohibited.
3. Vandalism is prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to, any attempt to harm or destroy the data of another user, the network/Internet, or any networks or sites connected to the network/Internet. Attempts to breach security codes and/or passwords will also be considered a form of vandalism.
4. The creation, propagation and/or use of computer viruses is prohibited.
5. The forgery, reading, deleting, copying or modifying of electronic mail messages of other users is prohibited.
6. Deleting, examining, copying or modifying files and/or data belonging to other users is prohibited.
7. Willful destruction of computer hardware or software, or attempts to exceed or modify the parameters of the system are prohibited. Nothing in this policy shall prohibit the Academy operator from intercepting and stopping Email messages which have the capacity to overload the computer resources. Discipline may be imposed for intentional overloading of the Academy computer resources.

Access to the E-mail and similar electronic communication systems is a privilege and certain responsibilities accompany that privilege. Academy users are expected to demonstrate the same level of ethical and professional manner as is required in face-to-face or written communications. Anonymous or forged messages will be treated as a violation of this policy.

1. Unauthorized attempts to access another person's Email or similar electronic communications or to use another's name, E-mail or computer address or workstation to send E-mail or similar electronic communications is prohibited and may subject the individual to disciplinary action.
2. All users must understand that the Academy cannot guarantee the privacy or confidentiality of electronic documents and any messages that are confidential as a matter of law should not be communicated over Email.
3. The Academy reserves the right, among other actions, to access E-mail to retrieve Academy information and records, to engage in routine computer maintenance and housekeeping, to carry out Internet investigations, or to disclose messages, data or files to law enforcement authorities.
4. Any information contained on an Academy computer's hard drive or computer disks which were purchased by the Academy are considered the property of the Academy.

This agreement applies to stand alone units as well as units connected to the network or the Internet. Any attempt to violate the provisions of the agreement will result in revocation of the user's privileges, regardless of the success or failure of the attempt. In addition, school disciplinary action, and/or appropriate legal action may be taken. The decision of the Academy regarding inappropriate use of the technology or telecommunication resources is final. Monetary remuneration will be sought for damage necessitating repair or replacement of equipment.

XVI. ATTENDANCE

The State of Illinois has a compulsory school attendance law (105 ILCS 5/Art. 26). Students and families who choose to attend Saint Bede Academy are in compliance with the State of Illinois compulsory school attendance law. It is the responsibility of parents/guardians to make sure that their student is in daily attendance at school

Ordinarily, these are the four valid reasons for student absence:

1. Illness
2. Death in the immediate family
3. Observance of religious holiday
4. Family emergency – situations beyond the control of the student and/or cases that cause reasonable concern to the parent for the safety or health of the student or which causes reasonable concern to the student for the safety or health of a parent or sibling.

The school day begins at 7:50 a.m. and ends at 2:40 p.m. Once students have arrived at the Academy for the school day, they are to remain until the school day is completed. Seniors, with permission, will be allowed to sign out in the main office after their last class of the day. Any student wishing to leave campus during the school day must receive permission from the parents, either in writing or by phone, and from the administration.

A. ABSENCES

All absences are to be reported to the Academy by 8:15 a.m. by the parents/guardians. Call the Academy at 815-223-3140, after following the prompts; choose option 1 "To report your child absent". If you need assistance choose the school office or the receptionist.

- If the parents/guardians fail to notify the school of their child's absence, the administration will contact the parents/guardians for verification.
- On the day the student returns to school from an absence, the student must present to the Administration a written note or absentee slip from the parents/guardians, stating the reason for the absence

Saint Bede Academy recognizes three (3) categories of absences

- Excused absences
- Unexcused Absences
- Truant absences (after the 9th unexcused absence)

Excused Absence: An excused absence is recognized as:

- A student's personal illness
- A death in the immediate family
- A family emergency
- Medical visits
- Other situations beyond the control of the student (such as court appearances, driver's tests)
- Mental Health Day (up to 5 per school year)
- Other reasons approved by the Administration, not including vacation.

A health care provider's note may be required to excuse a student and/or for returning to school after the third consecutive day of being reported ill. If medical documentation is not provided, the absence may be marked "unexcused." Students who have nine (9) or more days of absences due to being sick, the parents/guardians will be contacted and a conference with the administration will be held. The student may be placed on the Medical Excuse List.

Unexcused Absence: An unexcused absence is defined as an absence from school for a reason other than those listed above as an excused absence and/or absence not authorized by the student's parent/guardian or the Administration. When a student's absence is unexcused, the parent/guardian may recognize the absence as being valid or legitimate; however, the school does not. In addition, a student is not permitted to make up any course work missed, or to receive credit for an unexcused absence. The following are unexcused absences:

- Missing the bus
- Car issues
- Needed at home
- Other avoidable absences.

Truant Absences: Truancy is defined as an absence without valid cause for one or more period(s) of the student's school day. Parents/guardians may be notified following 3, 5, and 9 days of absence or tardies within a school year, and a school intervention may be initiated. After the 9th school day (5% of regular attendance days) on which a student is absent without valid cause, he/she is deemed to be truant under Illinois law. Interventions to address truancy may include attendance letters, parent/teacher/administration conferences, student counseling, and/or involvement of the county truancy officer and/or local law enforcement. No punitive action, including out-of-school suspensions or court action will be taken against a chronically truant student unless available support services and other resources have been provided to the student, or offered to the student and refused. Any person who has custody or control of a child subject to compulsory attendance who knowingly or willfully permits the child to persist in truancy, if convicted, is guilty of a Class C misdemeanor and may be subject to up to 30 days imprisonment and/or fine up to \$1,500.

THE ADMINISTRATION RESERVES THE RIGHT TO DETERMINE WHETHER AN ABSENCE IS EXCUSED OR UNEXCUSED.

B. MEDICAL EXCUSE LIST

Students with a past history of frequent absences and students with an ongoing record of frequent absences will be designated as medical excuse list students. These students will be required to provide a medical excuse from a physician in order to be excused for an illness-related absence. The following criteria may be grounds for inclusion on the medical excuse list:

1. Students with a previous history of 25 or more absences.
2. Absence from school for 10 or more days in a school year.

Major illness or accidents will be considered one "event" by providing a physician's note covering the days absent. Student status on the medical excuse list will end at the conclusion of each school year.

C. TARDINESS

Students are expected to be in class on time so they may maximize their learning opportunities. Teachers and the Administration will monitor student tardies. Students may be considered tardy if they arrive after the bell has rung.

1. When tardy, a student should not report to class without obtaining an admittance slip from the main office.
2. Parents may not give students permission to be late for school or excuse them from the obligation to be on time and in class.
3. Car trouble, car pool problems, oversleeping, fuel for vehicles, errands for parents are examples of unexcused tardies; however, the administration may grant an exception following a parent phone call if warranted.
4. On occasion, weather may be a valid excuse for a Period A tardy, as determined by administration.
5. Tardies are accumulated by the semester.

D. FAMILY VACATION AND TRIP ABSENCES:

Vacations and family trips should be coordinated with the school calendar. Family travel during the school year does interrupt a student's regular progress; however, we recognize the educational value of these trips. Early notice of travel will help school personnel to accommodate parents and students during that period. This requires the leave of absence form signed by all of the teachers. It will be the student's responsibility to obtain all missing work from their teachers during their absence. Some assignments may not be available until the student returns to school. Work shall be completed and returned to the teacher within three (3) days for the child to receive credit. It is the students responsibility to coordinate with their teachers.

E. MAKE UP WORK

Students who have excused absence(s) from school will be allowed to make up work for equivalent academic credit. The time allowed for make-up work will be one school day for every school day missed, starting with the first day the student returns to school. If a student misses five or more consecutive days, they will have seven calendar days to make up all missing work.

Day Missing	Work Due
Monday	Wednesday
Tuesday	Thursday
Wednesday & Thursday	Monday
Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, & Friday	Seven calendar days from the date of return.

In extenuating circumstances, a student may ask his/her teacher or the Administration for additional time to make up the school work (if the absences exceed 7 school days). It is the responsibility of the student (and his/her parents/guardian), not the teachers, to get the assignments, complete them, and turn them in, and to arrange a time with the teacher to make up any missed quizzes or tests. Incomplete work or failure to do the work may result in earning a zero on the assignment, which in turn, will lower the student's overall grade. If a student submits work due to an absence, please provide the teacher ample time to get assignments graded and inputted into the gradebook.

F. ATTENDANCE AT EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Students must be in attendance for a full school day to participate in practices or events unless excused by the administration. Students must be in attendance for four (4) class periods to attend practice or events. Students may not attend any after-school activity if they are not in attendance at least the last four periods or if they leave the school ill during the day.

Students must be in attendance on Friday to participate in a weekend event.

G. COLLEGE VISITS

It is highly recommended that JUNIORS and SENIORS visit colleges and universities in order to make a college choice and informed decision. This should be done on days when classes are not in session at Saint Bede. If for some reason this is not possible, permission to be absent must be arranged through the school counselor at least one week in advance. Juniors and seniors are allowed three (3) days per year for college visits. College visits will not be approved on senior retreat days or junior day of recollection.

XVII. DISCIPLINE

"Any student who engages in conduct, whether inside or outside of school, that is detrimental to the reputation of the school and/or inconsistent with the mission, philosophy, or teachings of the Catholic Church may be subject to disciplinary action including suspension or expulsion."

A. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this code of discipline is to protect the inalienable and contractual rights and duties of everyone connected with the school. For example, students have the right to be educated and the duty to study, while teachers have the right to be able to teach and the duty to do their best. Administrators have the right to make rules to safeguard these rights and require the fulfillment of these duties. As Pope John XXIII said in this encyclical *Pacem in Terris*, "to claim one's right and ignore one's duties, or only half fulfill them, is like building a house with one hand and tearing it down with the other."

We accept and expect our students and teachers to accept the traditional teaching of the Church that all persons have the right, "to the means necessary for the proper development of life" and, "the natural right to share in the benefits of culture, and hence to receive a good general education." "Every person has a natural right to be respected. Everyone has a right to his good name. Every person, the Church teaches, has a right to freedom in investigating the truth, and to freedom of speech and publication within the limits of moral order and the common good." (*Pacem in Terris*, sec. 1.)

Every person has the right to be able to worship God, and profess his religion both in private and in public. This and every other human right is bound up with as many duties. The right to seek out the truth implies the duty to devote oneself to an ever deeper and wider search for it. Administrators have the right and duty to demand that everyone in the school, "be guided by justice, respect the rights of others and do their duty, animated by such love as will make them feel the needs of others as their own." (*John XXIII*, *Opus cit.*)

The students and parents who choose to seek an education at Saint Bede are required to abide by the rules set down in this handbook and live by the standards of the Academy both in the school and at all extra-curricular activities or events. The Academy's discipline policy strives to hold students to a high code of behavior. The administration, faculty and staff of Saint Bede Academy seek to develop, along with the student body, a proper atmosphere for education, maturity, a sense of Christian morals and values and a responsibility for one's actions.

B. BUS GUIDELINES

Hall and LaSalle-Peru High School districts provide free transportation to students attending Saint Bede. Students using this transportation are under the jurisdiction of the bus driver, who may assign seats to any or all of the students on the bus. The authority of the bus driver should be considered the same as the authority of a teacher in the classroom. Changing weather and traffic conditions make it impossible for the bus to call for students at exactly the same time each day. Therefore, students should arrive at the bus stop at least five (5) minutes early and while waiting for the bus, show respect for other people's property and the roadway. The bus driver is responsible for the bus and the conduct of riders. If it becomes necessary for the bus driver to ask students to show or surrender their ID card, they are to do so without argument.

Conduct while riding on the bus:

1. All students must be seated and are not permitted to change seats while the bus is in motion or to annoy other riders.
2. Under no circumstances must students put their head or arms out of the windows and windows must not be lowered below the mark shown.
3. Students should treat bus equipment as they would valuable furniture in their own homes. Damage to seats, etc., must be paid by the offender.
4. In case of a road emergency, students will remain in the bus until instructions are given by the bus driver.
5. The use of profane or abusive language will not be tolerated.
6. Smoking or striking matches is not permitted on the bus.
7. Bus drivers are not permitted, except by proper authorization, to stop at places other than the regular bus stop.
8. Students will exit by the front door. The rear door is for emergency use only.
9. The throwing of any articles on the bus or out of the bus windows is prohibited.

NOTE: The sanction for disobeying any of the above is suspension of bus riding privileges.

C. AUTOMOBILES AND MOTORBIKES

Driving an automobile or motorbike to school is a privilege given to students who agree to observe the rules of the state and the school. All motorized vehicles must be registered with the business manager at class registration time. If the student decides to drive to and from school after this date, the student must register at that time. A small fee will be charged for registration, and the student will receive a sticker for the vehicle indicating that the student has permission to park in the student parking lot. The business manager will want to know the license number, year, make and color of the vehicle. All students must park in the student parking lot. Those who fail to park properly are subject to a fine. Cars parked in restricted areas may be towed.

The major abuses of the driving privilege are causing an accident, tardiness, leaving campus without permission and incorrect parking. Violations of the driving rules may result in the revocation of the driving privilege. Students have a serious obligation to come to school on time. When students drive others to school, this obligation is increased. **EXCESSIVE TARDINESS MAY RESULT IN SUSPENSION OF ALL DRIVING PRIVILEGES.** While classes are in session, students are not to leave campus. However, on occasions when a student must leave, he or she must receive permission from the Principal and from his or her parents.

D. DRESS CODE

All students are expected to dress appropriately at all times in order to promote self-respect and represent the high standards of Saint Bede Academy. The definition of these terms is left to the discretion of the Administration. In addition, the administration reserves the right to interpret and enforce this dress code policy as it sees fit. A student may be sent home to change clothes if his or her dress is in violation of the dress code.

Dress Code Days

Regular School Uniform

Every school day unless otherwise indicated in the planner.

Dennis Approved Apparel ONLY. (Alterations are prohibited on skirts and skorts.)

Mass Day Dress Code

On All-School Mass Days, students may dress up for Mass.

Men must wear a shirt, tie, and dress slacks.

Women must wear an appropriate length dress or skirt (no more than 2" above the knee), dress slacks, and a modest top. No revealing neckline, crop-tops, or tank tops are permitted. No jeans or sweatpants are permitted for a Mass day. There are two options for Mass Days: the regular dress code Dennis Uniform or dressing up for Mass.

Free Jeans Day

When announced or as indicated in the planner, students may wear jeans with a casual sleeved top. No hooded or crop-top sweatshirts or tank-tops. Jeans must be in good repair; no holes or rips, made of denim, and must not be altered. There are two options on this day: Follow the Regular Dress Code or follow Jeans Day dress code. No dresses, skirts, or sweatpants are permitted.

\$3.00 Jeans Day

When announced or as indicated in the planner, students may wear jeans with a casual sleeved top with a required donation of \$3.00 to help support charitable or Academy organizations. No hooded or crop-top sweatshirts or tank-tops. Jeans must be in good repair; no holes or rips, made of denim, and must not be altered. There are two options on this day: Follow the Regular Dress Code or follow Jeans Day dress code. No dresses, skirts, or sweatpants are permitted.

\$5.00 Sweat Pants Day

When announced or as indicated in the planner, students may wear sweatpants with a casual sleeved top with a required donation of \$5.00 to help support charitable or Academy organizations. No hooded or crop-top sweatshirts or tank-tops, leggings, or sleeping pants will be allowed. There are two options on this day: Follow the Regular Dress Code or follow Sweat Pants Day dress code. No dresses or other items will be permitted as a substitute.

STUDENTS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO WEAR ANY CLOTHING THAT REVEALS THE MIDRIF, TANK TOPS, OR CONTAINS RIPS IN THE SHIRTS OR IN THE PANTS.

Accessories/Grooming/General

Undershirts worn under a short or long-sleeve dress code top, that are visible at the neckline, must be a solid white, black, or gray crew neck shirt. Long-sleeve undershirts cannot be worn under short-sleeve dress code tops.

Ladies knee socks must be solid white, green or black & ladies tights must be solid black. Knee socks & tights must be purchased from Dennis uniform. Fishnet stockings are not allowed.

Gentlemen must have their dress code shirts tucked in.

Belts (brown or black only) are required. Belts can be purchased from Dennis or purchased elsewhere.

Students must wear shoes that have a closed back. Dress or Tennis Shoes are permitted. Sandals, Crocs, and slippers are not allowed. Shoes must be tied at all times.

The wearing of earrings is permitted. Jewelry or piercings that “gauge” or stretch the earlobe are strictly prohibited at school. Jewelry for other facial or body piercing is strictly prohibited at school.

Hair must be clean, neat and well-groomed at all times. Hair accessories must be solid white, green or black. If a student has dyed their hair an unnatural color during the summer, they are not permitted to re-dye their hair the unnatural color during the course of the school year. Violation of this policy will require corrective action or remedy within 72 hours.

Students on athletic teams that have a “game day” top are only allowed to wear it on game days during their sport season. After the conclusion of their season they will be allowed to wear this top on Dress Code Schedule 2 and 3 days.

All accessory items found in the Saint Bede Academy section of the Dennis catalog are approved and available on the Dennis website.

E. CLASSROOM RULES

1. Students are to be quiet and maintain good order in class. Following the bell, students are to remain seated until the teacher gives permission to leave.
2. Students are not to leave class if the teacher is not on time. Students are to wait five (5) minutes and then send a member of the class to the main office to notify the Principal, who will then come to the class and handle the situation.
3. All types of vandalism are prohibited: writing on walls, desks or other furniture, damaging screens or shades, etc. Students damaging property are responsible for the cost of repair.
4. Sitting on desks and windowsills is prohibited.
5. Students are expected to bring books, paper and writing instruments to class. Additional classroom rules may be established at the discretion of the individual instructor.

F. STUDY HALL REGULATIONS

1. All students must report to the study hall until attendance has been finalized.
2. Students assigned to a study hall are expected to be on time. Attendance will be taken.
3. Each student should take an available desk or the one assigned.
4. Each student should bring necessary books, Chromebook, paper and pens or pencils that he or she will need for the entire period. Generally, no permission will be given to leave the study hall (i.e., to go to lockers, bathrooms, etc.) during the period.
5. There will be no sleeping or game playing of any kind during the study hall period.
6. There will be no talking without the explicit permission of the moderator and, when permission is given, the student will be expected to talk quietly.
7. If a student wishes to be excused from study hall, the student must make prior arrangements with the teacher or appropriate person.

G. STUDENT DATEBOOK

Students receive a student datebook at the beginning of the school year. Students are expected to bring their datebook with them to every class. Any student who leaves a classroom, study hall or the refectory during school hours must have the datebook signed in the appropriate place by the teacher or moderator. Failure to do so will result in a detention. During homeroom, only students going to scheduled meetings or appointments do not need to have their datebook signed.

H. LOCKERS

At the beginning of the school year each student is assigned a personal locker. Once a student is assigned a locker, the student is not to change to another locker without the permission of the person in charge of lockers. **LOCKERS MUST BE KEPT LOCKED AT ALL TIMES.** Students should not give their combinations to others. The school is not responsible for any loss or damage to books or other personal belongings in lockers. Any theft or vandalism should be reported promptly to the Principal. Saint Bede Academy reserves the right to check lockers at any time. Each student is responsible for any damage to the locker. Any problem with a locker should be promptly reported to the School Secretary or the Principal. **Lockers can be searched at any time.**

I. BOOKBAGS

Book bags and purses are not to be taken to the classroom. Purses may be taken to the Student Refectory during the lunch period.

J. CAFETERIA

During all meals in the student cafeteria, courtesy and self-respect demand that:

1. Everyone will take his or her turn in the cafeteria line and avoid crowding, line cutting and shouting.
2. Communication with kitchen staff should be kind and controlled.
3. Noise will be kept at a minimum to help ensure a pleasant atmosphere for eating and conversation.
4. Every student is to clean up his or her table, placing the tray on the rack provided and trash in the garbage can.
5. If an accident occurs, the one responsible is to clean it up, asking the moderator for cleaning supplies.

K. EATING, DRINKING AND GUM CHEWING

Eating and drinking in the school building is limited to the student refectory and the PSC Commons. No food or drink is to be taken from these areas unless a student is going directly out of doors. **There is to be no chewing of gum at any time in the school building.**

L. FACULTY/STAFF WORK ROOMS, LOUNGE, AND RESTROOMS

Students are not permitted in any faculty/staff area. Students who have messages should give them to the main office to place in the faculty mailboxes. Organization and club moderators will distribute mail to student officers.

M. OFF-CAMPUS PERMISSION

NO STUDENT is allowed to leave the Saint Bede campus at any time during the school day unless he or she has received explicit permission from the Principal. Parental knowledge and consent are necessary to gain permission. All students must report at 7:50 a.m. each morning. Students will not be permitted to return to the parking lot during the school day.

Seniors may leave campus after their last class provided they sign out in the main office and have no further classes. Seniors who sign out after their last class must be out of the main building before the next class begins and are not to return to campus unless they participate in sports, in which case they are to be confined to locker rooms of the gym. Students who become sick during the day must see the School Secretary or Principal before leaving campus. Parents must be notified as to the student's illness before he or she leaves campus.

N. SEARCH POLICY

The Administration of Saint Bede Academy reserves the right to search the locker, coat, and personal belongings of the student at the school or at the school-sponsored event. Any car that is parked on Saint Bede property is subject to the same search. This search may be conducted by and of the Administrative staff or anyone chosen by the administration to conduct such a search. Students who do not cooperate with the searcher may be expelled. To be clear, Saint Bede reserves the right to search anything brought on school property.

XVIII. DISCIPLINARY SANCTIONS

A. DETENTION

As a means of handling disciplinary problems, students will be given a one-hour detention to be served on the day of or day after the detention is issued. Students will be required to find their own transportation home. Appointments, work or sports are not acceptable excuses for missing detention. Detentions to be served may extend beyond the completion of the school year. Un-served detentions may delay the release of final grade reports or transcripts.

B. SATURDAY MORNING DETENTION

Saturday Morning Detention sessions will be scheduled as needed to serve as a disciplinary consequence replacing In-School Suspensions. Students will be limited to a maximum of four (4) Saturday Morning Detention sessions per semester. Students who exceed this total will receive a one-day Out-of-School Suspension for each subsequent offense that would normally be handled through Saturday Morning Detention. If a student is dismissed from a Saturday Morning Detention for unacceptable behavior, that student no longer has the Saturday Morning Detention option available. The one-day Out-of-School Suspension alternative will then be in effect for that student. Each student that receives a Saturday Morning Detention will be assessed a \$10.00 fee, payable on the Saturday that it is served. The Principal or the Principal's designee will administer Saturday Morning Detentions.

The following procedure will be in effect for Saturday Morning Detentions:

1. Saturday Morning Detentions will begin promptly at 8:00 a.m. and dismiss at 12:00 p.m.
2. Attendance is mandatory, and supersedes all other school activities.
3. The student and parents will be notified in advance of a scheduled Saturday Detention.
4. Students will be assigned a Saturday Morning Detention for accumulation of detentions or tardies, and/or other misconduct as determined by the Saint Bede Academy Parent-Student Handbook.
5. Students who fail to attend or arrive late for their assigned Saturday Morning Detention will receive appropriate consequences, to be determined by the administration.
6. One washroom break will be given at 10:00 a.m., for five (5) minutes.
7. Students will not be allowed to sleep, lay their heads on the desk, or put their feet up.
8. No food or drink will be allowed.
9. Students who misbehave or are uncooperative during a Saturday Morning Detention will be sent home immediately. Appropriate consequences will follow.
10. Students should bring enough homework or appropriate reading material to keep them busy.
11. Students may not leave the building or the campus.
12. Saturday Morning Detentions may include service to the Academy in lieu of study. This service will be scheduled according to necessity and weather and will not fulfill service hour commitments.
13. A student will be suspended for a one week period from activities or athletic events beginning on the day the Saturday Morning Detention is issued.

C. SUSPENSION

Although not as severe as dismissal, the suspension of a student can lead to eventual dismissal if the situation demands. Students on suspension are not allowed to participate in or attend extra-curricular activities on the day of the suspension. If a student is suspended for violation of school rules and regulations, he or she will be suspended for a one-week period from activities or athletic events for each day of suspension. Students will be placed on disciplinary probation.

Suspension is a warning to students and parents that the behavior exhibited is not in keeping with the philosophy of Saint Bede Academy and, if continued, may lead to dismissal. Suspension is used on specific behavior as cited in the handbook or when the administration determines it to be necessary. Parents will be notified of suspension, and a conference must be held before a student is re-admitted.

D. DISCIPLINARY PROBATION

A student may be placed on disciplinary probation for a serious infraction or for repeated infractions of disciplinary regulations. This includes ineligibility for extra-curricular activities as well as social probation. The term of the probation will be established by the Principal. Students that violate their probation may be permanently dismissed from Saint Bede Academy.

E. SOCIAL PROBATION

Social probation allows a student to continue to be part of extracurricular activities, but will not allow him/her to represent the school as part of a team or organization. Further, the student will not be allowed to participate in other social activities (athletic contests or dramatic performances, etc.) that they are not a member of and they may only attend required school trips and functions connected with the Academy. For Athletics, a student will be required to continue to practice with the team, and to sit with the team, but will not be in uniform or play in the games. All other extra-curricula will have a policy on the implications of social probation for the student who participates in that activity. The policy regarding particular extra-curricular activities will be consulted in determining the nature of social probation for the particular student. The period of probation begins on the day the student meets with the administration.)

F. ACTION PLAN/BEHAVIORAL CONTRACTS

In some cases, the administration may deem it necessary for a student to agree to an Action Plan/Behavioral Contract as a condition to continued enrollment at the Academy. Signatures of both the student and the parent/guardian on the plan/contract imply agreement with conditions and consequences that are listed.

G. DISMISSAL

Saint Bede Academy reserves the right to dismiss any student, at any time whatsoever, for reason of deficiency in scholarship, unsatisfactory conduct, or for any other just cause.

H. THREATENING BEHAVIOR (ORAL, ELECTRONIC OR WRITTEN)**

The Administration will view all threats to people or property as serious and will deal with them appropriately. Any student determined to have been involved in such threats is liable to dismissal. **When any threat is made, law enforcement will be contacted to determine the appropriate next steps. At the minimum, the student will be suspended until the threat has been fully investigated and is potentially liable to dismissal from Saint Bede Academy.**

I. HARASSMENT**, BULLYING**, AND CYBER-BULLYING**

According to StopBullying.gov, the definition of bullying is:“unwanted, aggressive behavior among school-aged students that involve a real or perceived power imbalance. The behavior is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time.”

The key point is that bullying is targeted, intentional, and repetitive; it is a pattern of behaviors that harms a student.

Bullying can take many forms, and there are four categories of bullying:

- 1) **Verbal Bullying** – This includes teasing, name-calling, inappropriate sexual comments, and taunting.
- 2) **Social Bullying** – Often referred to as relational bullying, social bullying happens when someone is trying to deliberately hurt another’s reputation. This includes spreading rumors, repeatedly excluding someone, and telling other students not to be friends with someone.
- 3) **Physical Bullying** – This includes hitting, pushing, tripping, stealing possessions, and sexual assault. Boys are more likely to participate in physical bullying than girls.
- 4) **Cyberbullying** – Cyberbullies use the internet (social media, mostly) to target their victims. Rumors and insults can quickly spread through social media, and it’s nearly impossible to eradicate them.

Sometimes, we may categorize certain behaviors as bullying, but they’re not deliberate or repetitive. Conflict and drama are not always bullying.

Bullying is NOT:

- 1) **Excluding someone** – It is not considered bullying if a student is excluded. Repeated and deliberate exclusion, however, can be bullying.
- 2) **Disliking someone** – Students may verbally or nonverbally communicate their dislike of another student. This is okay, as long as they don’t start rumors or verbally abuse the other student.
- 3) **Accidental physical harm** – A student might unintentionally bump into or trip another student. This is not bullying if it is not deliberate.
- 4) **Being “bossy”** – Some students take the role of being a leader and turn it into bossiness.. Learning to lead skillfully is a lifelong process, and most students haven’t mastered it.
- 5) **Telling a joke about someone (once)** – While this is not great behavior, it is not considered bullying unless there are repeated instances. Of course we should teach our students that one single joke about someone may hurt that student’s feelings, and it’s not okay.
- 6) **Arguments** – We all argue, and arguments will inevitably happen at school.

While the above six behaviors are not ideal, they are not bullying. And as parents and educators, we should teach students to refrain from acting in ways that may hurt another, whether it’s a one-time thing or not. Nonetheless, it’s important to understand the difference between bullying and general conflict or unskilled behavior.

It is the policy of Saint Bede Academy that bullying, cyber-bullying, or harassment will not be tolerated. Students are expected to be civil, polite, and fully engaged in the learning process. Students who act inappropriately are not fully engaged in the learning process. This policy is in effect while the students are on school grounds, in school vehicles, at designated bus stops, at school-sponsored activities, or at school-sanctioned events, and while away from school grounds if the misconduct directly affects the good order, efficient management, and welfare of Saint Bede Academy. Bullying of students by electronic communication is prohibited whether or not such communication originated at school or with school equipment, if the communication is specifically directed at students or school personnel and concerns harassment, intimidation, or bullying at school.

“Bullying” means any pattern of harassment, intimidation, threatening behavior, physical acts, verbal or electronic communication directed toward a student or group of students that results in or is reasonably perceived as being done with the intent to cause negative educational or physical results for the targeted individual or group and is communicated in such a way as to disrupt or interfere with the school’s educational mission or the education of any student. Such behavior is specifically prohibited.

“Electronic communication” means the communication of any written, verbal, or pictorial information by means of an electronic device, including, but not limited to, a telephone, a cellular telephone or other wireless communication device, or a computer, or social media is defined as verbal/written abuse and/or harassment directed towards another person on an online platform.

Cyber-Bullying via social media is defined as verbal/written abuse and/or harassment directed towards another person on an online platform.

An example of this type of activity includes but is not limited to: insults/negative comments that are created/posted on Facebook/Instagram/Snap-Chat/BeReal/Tik-Tok (or any other social communication platform – such as texts or group texts). This type of activity is hurtful to others. Accusatory or abusive attacks are not tolerated at Saint Bede Academy and will result in disciplinary action.

Any student who feels that he/she is being harassed or bullied in any way should report the incident to the school counselor and/or the assistant principal.

- An example of this type of activity includes but is not limited to: insults/negative comments that are created/posted on Facebook/Instagram/Snap-Chat/BeReal/Tik-Tok (or any other social communication platform – such as texts or group texts).

“Threatening behavior” means any pattern of behavior or isolated action, whether or not it is directed at another person, that a reasonable person would believe indicates potential for future harm to student, school personnel, or school property.

Harassment set forth below may include, but is not limited to, the following:

1. Verbal, physical, or written abuse;
2. Repeated remarks of a demeaning nature;
3. Implied or explicit threats;
4. Demeaning jokes, stories, or activities directed at the student;
5. Unwelcome physical contact.

In administering discipline, consideration will be given to alternative methods of punishment to ensure that the most effective discipline is administered in each case. In all disciplinary action, teachers and administrators will be mindful of the fact that they are dealing with individual personalities.

In considering alternatives of the corrective actions, the administration of the school will consider those listed below. However, the school is not limited to these alternative methods, nor does this list reflect an order or sequence of events to follow in disciplinary actions.

1. Conference with student
2. Conference with parents
3. Restorative Conference
4. In-school suspension
5. Detention
6. Possible law enforcement
7. Behavioral contract
8. Changing student’s seat assignment or class assignment
9. Requiring a student to make financial restitution for damaged property
10. Requiring a student to clean or straighten items or facilities damaged by the student’s behavior
11. Restriction of privileges
12. Involvement of local authorities
13. Referring students to appropriate social agency or to a delinquency prevention and diversion program administered by the Office of Juvenile Affairs

14. Suspension

15. Other appropriate disciplinary action as required and as indicated by the circumstances which may include, but is not limited to, removal from eligibility to participate or attend extracurricular activities as well as removal from the privilege of attending or participating in the graduation ceremony, school dances, prom, prom activities, and/or class trips, or dismissal from Saint Bede Academy.

Any type of bullying or harassment is hurtful to others. Accusatory or abusive attacks are not tolerated at Saint Bede Academy and will result in disciplinary action.

Any student who feels that he/she is being harassed or bullied in any way should report the incident to the school counselor and/or Assistant Principal. Harassment and bullying behavior shall not be tolerated and the student bully is subject to disciplinary sanctions including dismissal.

J. RESPECT FOR FACULTY, STAFF, AND STUDENTS

All students are expected to give all individuals associated with Saint Bede Academy the respect due to a fellow child of Christ. Disrespect to any others is considered a serious breach of Christian conduct.

Classroom behavior must be polite and respectful between staff and students. Any misconduct will be handled by either the classroom teacher or staff member or Saint Bede Administration.

K. RESTORATIVE CONFERENCES

Saint Bede Academy will make use of restorative conferences in the event of disagreements or disciplinary issues between students. These conferences bring the students together, monitored by an administrator, to explain the disagreement and come to a mutual understanding.

L. RIGHT OF REVIEW IN CASE OF DISMISSAL

A student who is accused of wrongdoing and is called for questioning may request a hearing with the administration. If the administration advises withdrawal of a student, the parents/guardians are so informed; and, if they accept the decision, no further action is necessary. In cases involving dismissal, upon request of the parents/guardians of the student involved, the case will be reviewed by the Academy Board of Directors. The parents/guardians must request the hearing in writing to the President of the Board within five (5) working days of the dismissal. The President will convene the Board to hear the request and vote by secret ballot on the matter. The Board may hear any testimony or evidence it believes will help to decide the issues including, but not limited to, the student's full disciplinary and academic record. A majority vote of the Board either to uphold or reverse the decision of the administration will be the final decision on matters involving dismissal. Re-admittance, following a decision by the Board for dismissal is qualified by the following:

1. A student may not be re-admitted until two semesters have passed and an application for re-admittance has been made to the administration.
2. A student may be readmitted on any conditions that the administration deems appropriate.

M. NAME, IMAGE, LIKENESS POLICY**

Students/individuals are prohibited from using the Saint Bede Academy name, logos, or likeness in the creation of any social media page names or "handles" without the express written consent of Saint Bede Academy. Students/individuals could face disciplinary action, such as detention, suspension, dismissal as well as possible legal charges. Any student/individual contributing to any unauthorized Saint Bede Academy social media account is liable to disciplinary action.

N. CONDUCT UNBECOMING OF A SAINT BEDE STUDENT**

Any behavior based on a reasonable person's standard that affects another student's ability to fully participate in the benefits of Saint Bede Academy or which negatively impacts the school community, including, but not limited to:

- Failure to show due respect and courtesy to others
- Excessive noise
- Obscene behavior, language, or gestures
- Disorderly conduct
- General indecency

is subject to disciplinary action.

Students are expected to be civil, polite, and fully engaged in the learning process. Students who act inappropriately are not fully engaged in the learning process. This policy is in effect while the students are on school grounds, in school vehicles, at designated bus stops, at school-sponsored activities, or at school-sanctioned events, and while away from school grounds if the misconduct directly affects the good order, efficient management, and welfare of Saint Bede Academy.

XX. POLICY ON TOBACCO USE/VAPING

Saint Bede Academy students are expected to demonstrate appropriate behavior that imitates respect for self, peers, and authority figures. Saint Bede Academy personnel partner with parents/guardians in creating a safe, Christ-centered learning environment. Because of this, students are prohibited from possessing or using tobacco/vape products in school. In an effort to keep our school environment safe, Saint Bede Academy has had tobacco/vape detectors installed in the restrooms and locker rooms. These vape detectors are extremely accurate in identifying the use of tobacco and vape products. In addition, Saint Bede Academy has security cameras at the entrance to these facilities.

Any student who uses or is suspected to use tobacco/vapes in the school or on school grounds will earn a disciplinary referral. Students will be verified through the cameras and the vape detectors, questioned, and will earn disciplinary action (based on the discretion of the Administration) – whether tobacco or a vape device is on the person or not. It is Saint Bede Academy's hope that students avoid using these products – and if caught, are honest and forthright with Administration.

XXI. POLICY ON ALCOHOL, ILLEGAL DRUG USE*^, CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE ANALOG^ OR ILLICIT USE OF ANY SUBSTANCE**

*Illegal drug use includes the misuse of prescription or over-the-counter drugs to induce an illegal-drug like state.

**"Controlled substance analog" or "analog" means a substance that has a chemical structure similar to that of a controlled substance... (720 ILCS 570/402).

Saint Bede Academy does not at any time condone the use of alcohol or illegal drugs by its students. Aware that it cannot monitor everything its students do, the school nonetheless is prepared to do all within its power to discourage the use of alcohol and/or illegal drugs, and to assist students who have a problem with alcohol and/or illegal drugs. The primary purpose of this policy is to assist and educate the student who has a problem involving alcohol or drugs.

Violation: If at any time while a student is enrolled (from the time a student enters as a freshman or transfer student until the time a student graduates or his/her records are transferred out) at Saint Bede Academy, a student admits to or the administration determines a student to be involved in, the use or possession of alcohol, or the use or possession of any illegal drug, that student is in violation of the Saint Bede Academy policy on alcohol and illegal drug use.

Procedure:

For any violation of the Alcohol/Drug policy a student will follow this procedure:

1. Once the administration has established that a student is in violation of the Alcohol-Drug Policy, the student will be suspended from classes until the student has complied with items 2 and 3 of this procedure.
2. The student and his/her parents/guardians will meet with the Principal or Principal's Designee, who will make a recommendation to the Principal.
3. The Principal or Principal's Designee and the student and his/her parents/guardians will develop a written action plan that will be signed by the student and his/her parents/guardian.
4. The student will schedule a professional alcohol/drug assessment within 30 days. The student will undergo a professional alcohol/drug assessment and will agree to comply with the recommendations of the treatment plan. The student and his/her parents/guardians will sign an agreement for a mutual release of information between the treatment provider and Saint Bede Academy. The content of the assessment and treatment plan as well as any other information exchanged with the treatment provider is considered confidential. The student will be allowed to attend classes upon verification of a scheduled assessment.
5. The Principal or Principal's Designee will monitor compliance with the action plan.
6. Failure to comply with the Action Plan will require a student to again appear before the Principal or Principal's Designee to review his/her status at Saint Bede.
7. The student who will not follow this procedure will be dismissed from the Academy.

Sanctions:

In addition to what is contained in the action plan, the student will be subject to the following sanctions:

1. Sale or distribution of alcohol or illegal drugs: The student is subject to immediate dismissal from school.
2. Use or Possession of Alcohol, Illegal Drugs, Controlled Substance Analog or Illicit Use of any Substance
 - A. First Violation:
 - (1) The student is subject to dismissal (OR)
 - (2) a. Social probation for 30 calendar days.
(Social Probation: Social probation allows a student to continue to be part of extracurricular activities, but will not allow him/her to represent the school as part of a team or organization. Further, the student will not be allowed to participate in other social activities (athletic contests, dramatic performances, etc.) that they are not a member of and they may only attend required school trips and functions connected with the Academy. For Athletics, a student will be required to continue to practice with the team, and to sit with the team, but will not be in uniform or play in the games. All other extra-curricular will have a policy on the implications of social probation for the student who participates in that activity. The policy regarding particular extra-curricular activities will be consulted in determining the nature of social probation for the particular student. The period of probation begins on the day the student meets with the Principal or Principal's Designee.)
 - b. Random drug tests for a six-month period.
 - c. 30 hours of community service.
 - d. One page reflection.
 - B. Second Violation: The student will most likely be dismissed.
3. Violation of this policy on the Property of Benedictine Society of Saint Bede or at a Saint Bede Academy event. In addition to the above sanctions, the student will receive minimally a three-day out of school suspension for each offense.

XXII. POLICY ON SCREENING FOR DRUG USAGE

SECTION I STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

Saint Bede Academy is committed to providing the most optimal educational environment possible for all students attending this school. In order to assist parents, the primary educators of their children, and to work toward the establishment of a safe and drug-free environment, screening of all students for drug usage is to be adopted during the 2002-2003 school year.

Saint Bede Academy recognizes its duty to honor the family and to assist it. We wish to ensure the protection of security and health in all matters, but in a special way with regard to dangers such as drug usage.

The program of screening for drug usage is intended to

- (1) deter young adults from beginning or continuing drug use, and
- (2) identify young adults who are harmfully involved in drug use so that they can be steered into appropriate drug education and treatment.

We wish to empower our students with knowledge and skills in order to make responsible decisions about their behaviors. We believe that the most effective deterrent to drug usage is openness and communication among students, parents, and the school community. This collaborative effort serves to enhance all aspects of school life in order to produce healthy, positive and productive citizens.

Attendance at Saint Bede Academy is not a right, but it is a privilege. With this privilege comes certain responsibilities. We hold students and their parents, guardians, to a high code of behavior in areas that affect the well-being and safety of all students. All students and parents are required to consent to participation in all the aspects of this policy as a condition of the student's continued enrollment at Saint Bede Academy.

SECTION II PROHIBITIONS

Students will be screened for drug usage utilizing Psychemedics Corporation Proprietary Drug Testing Services, employing radioimmunoassay technology in the analysis of hair (RIAH) and post-positive GC/MS, LC/MS or MS/MS confirmation testing. Specifically, samples will be submitted to Psychemedics for RIAH detection of the presence of Cocaine, Opiates, Phencyclidine (PCP), Marijuana, and Methamphetamine. Post-positive testing includes GC/MS, LC/MS or MS/MS confirmation for Benzoyllecgonine (Cocaine Metabolite), Opiates (Heroin/Morphine/Codeine), PCP, Carboxy-THC (Marijuana Metabolite), Methamphetamine. The use of such drugs or any controlled analog* by students without legitimate medical authorization is prohibited. Saint Bede Academy reserves the right to test for additional drug substances as such screening becomes available. **"Controlled substance analog" or "analog" means a substance...that has a chemical structure similar to that of a controlled substance...(720 ILCS 570/402).*

SECTION III SCREENING FOR DRUG ABUSE

Students enrolled at Saint Bede Academy will be screened for drug usage as follows:

1. ANNUAL SCREENING

All students will be screened for drugs at least once per year.

2. RANDOM SCREENING

Any student enrolled at Saint Bede Academy is subject to screening for drug usage on a randomly selected basis in addition to the annual screening. Consequently, some students may be tested more than once a year.

3. FOLLOW-UP SCREENING

Any student found to be in violation of this policy will be subject to follow-up screening. Such follow-up screening will take place at some point one hundred (100) days after the student has received a positive test result.

4. TRANSFER STUDENTS

All transfer students shall submit to screening for drug usage on a date as soon as possible after applying for admission. Admission is not complete until the screening has taken place and results showing the absence of drug usage are obtained.

SECTION IV DRUG SCREENING METHOD

Saint Bede Academy will use hair-sampling procedures for the purposes of this policy implementation. A small sample of head hair will be collected from the students by trained personnel. However, students who wear a short hairstyle must understand that body hair collected from the arm or leg will be used for the drug screening method if the trained personnel are unable to obtain a sufficient amount of head hair.

SECTION V NOTIFICATION OF TEST RESULTS

Notification of test results will be given to the Drug Screening Coordinator of the program at Saint Bede Academy by Psychomedics Corporation Proprietary Drug Testing Services. The Drug Screening Coordinator will also notify the principal. Parents and guardians and students shall be notified of a negative or positive test result as soon as possible by the Drug Screening Coordinator.

If a student tests positive for prohibited substances, that student and his parents or guardians shall be required to meet with the Drug Screening Coordinator to determine appropriate follow-up steps. Such a student will be required to receive an immediate assessment by a substance abuse professional approved by the Drug Screening Coordinator. This student and his family must agree to follow the plan of treatment established by the substance abuse professional and must agree to provide the school with the initial assessment and information regarding a plan of treatment. The assessment of any student engaged in extracurricular activities must consider whether this student will be allowed to continue to engage in extra-curricular activities or what limitations will be placed upon such activities. The substance abuse professional shall be required to advise the school if the student fails to follow the plan of treatment, in which case the student will be subject to school discipline, including the possibility of expulsion. Upon completion of necessary treatment, the student must submit to follow-up testing as set forth in Section III above or such other method as proposed by the substance abuse professional and agreed to by Saint Bede Academy. All costs associated with assessment, treatment and follow-up testing shall be borne by the student or the student's parents or guardians.

In the case of students who test positively for prohibited substances on a second or more occasion during their high school career, the Principal will determine the appropriate discipline, including the possibility of recommending expulsion.

Saint Bede Academy will make responsible attempts to keep information respecting positive drug tests and the follow-up procedures of the school confidential. However, the school cannot be responsible for information that is shared with others by the student or the parents or guardians of the student.

SECTION VI APPEAL OF TEST RESULTS

If the student or his or her family feels the test results are erroneous, the student or family has the right to request that a second test be taken. This test must be requested and taken within three days of the positive result. The cost shall be borne by the student, parents or guardians. Furthermore, all requests for a second test will also be submitted to Psychomedics for hair analysis and the student may not alter their hairstyle prior to the second test. If the second test results vary from the first test results, the school and the parents or guardians will discuss the further action to be taken.

SECTION VII RETENTION OF RECORDS

No documentation pertaining to each student's screening for drug usage will be made part of the student's permanent record. All documentation will be kept in a separate confidential file with the Drug Screening Coordinator.

SECTION VIII ANNUAL NOTIFICATION

Saint Bede Academy will submit a report to the Office of the Catholic Schools by June 15th of each year. This report shall include data on the number of students tested (but not their names), the dates of the tests and the number of negative and the number of positive results obtained. A short descriptive analysis of the program for that year shall also be included.

XXIII. DRUG SCREENING

Saint Bede Academy is mandated to follow all provisions of the Policy on Screening for Drug Usage. The Policy on Screening for Drug Usage is included in this Parent/Guardian-Student Handbook in its entirety. According to the Policy on Screening for Drug Usage, this policy is in effect for the entire high school career of any student enrolled at Saint Bede Academy. Saint Bede Academy has also promulgated its own additional policies in regard to drug screening including disciplinary action. The main goal of Saint Bede Academy's drug screening program is to ensure that the school is a safe learning environment.

Out of concern for all the students and the larger community, Saint Bede Academy will seek to deter any serious drug problem by helping to ensure that no student at the school is using illegal drugs. Saint Bede Academy uses the diocesan approved drug testing facility for its hair analysis drug test. During the school year, all students will be screened for drug usage at least one (1) time. Up to 20% of the students may also be selected during the school year for an additional random drug-screening test. Consequently, some students will be tested more than once a year. The reason for random screening is to provide an ongoing deterrent from drug usage on the part of our students.

Saint Bede Academy reserves the right to require drug-screening tests of those students whom the Superintendent, Principal or Chaplain believes exhibit behavior/s ordinarily associated with drug usage. If the parents/guardians of a student refuse to give permission for their student to be tested, the Principal will notify the Superintendent of the School and action will be taken to formally expel the student. If a student tests positive for drug usage, the student and parents/guardians will be contacted by the Principal or Principal's Designee to schedule a conference to be attended by the Parents/Guardians and student. The meeting will include the following:

1. Explanation of the student's test result
2. Explanation of the contract to be established
3. Requirement that the student seeks an assessment at an outside agency approved by the Principal within 30 calendar days
4. Explanation of the appeal process

If a student decides to appeal a positive test result, he/she must follow the steps referenced in the *Student-Parent/Guardian Handbook* in the Policy on Screening for Drug Usage. During the appeal process, the student is prohibited from participating in the school sponsored athletics/activities program.

Additionally, students must be aware that a positive drug test will result in disciplinary action being enacted by the Saint Bede Academy Principal. Such disciplinary procedures are outlined under the section of this handbook entitled "Policy on Alcohol, Illegal Drugs, Controlled Substance Analog or Illicit Use of any Substance".

XXIV. POLICY ON STUDENT PREGNANCY AND PATERNITY

Saint Bede Academy shall uphold the teachings and disciplines of the Roman Catholic Church concerning the dignity of human life and the right of the unborn child.

Saint Bede Academy believes, supports, and emphasizes the need to make moral choices in compliance with the doctrines and teachings of the Roman Catholic Church regarding sexual abstinence, premarital sex, and abortion. Saint Bede Academy recognizes its moral responsibility toward the pregnant student, the student who fathered the child, the unborn child, and the student body. Compromise of these doctrines, by word or deed, may be cause for discipline.

The Saint Bede Academy superintendent, principal, and school chaplain shall make every effort to assist and support the pregnant student, the student known to have fathered the child, and their parents/guardians in continuing the students' Catholic education program.

Saint Bede shall treat with commensurate fairness and justice the child, the pregnant student, and the student that fathered the child. All policies will be administered without discrimination to all parties.

In keeping with the ancient belief and practice of the Roman Catholic Church, abortion is not an acceptable option for pregnant women. Students who are known to have procured an abortion or participated directly in such a decision will be given special counseling. If the student is not responsive to the counseling, the student may be required to withdraw from Saint Bede Academy.

Administrative Regulation for Pregnancy – Female

1. Pregnancy is not a condition that constitutes exclusion or expulsion.
2. When school personnel are informed that a student is pregnant, designated personnel shall meet with the pregnant student and her parents/guardians to inform them of the information given to them indicating that the student is pregnant.
3. School personnel will inform the student and her parents/guardians of the services that are available within the local community for medical and neonatal care.
4. The school superintendent and/or principal will review the student's schedule and discuss what adjustments need to be made to enable the student to continue her educational plan. Participation in school-sponsored activities shall be determined on a case-by-case basis by the superintendent and/or principal.
5. The pregnant student is expected to exercise appropriate discretion regarding the pregnancy in relationship to other members of the student body.
6. Children born of a female student are not to be brought to the campus during the school hours, or other school sponsored events without the permission of the superintendent and/or principal.
7. Pregnant students will be required to participate in counseling services through Catholic Charities in LaSalle, IL or other equivalent programs as approved by the superintendent and/or principal. These programs will provide pregnancy-planning services including referrals to WIC/Public Aid, Medicare, and other supportive services available in the community. The options of parenting and open adoption will be explored, and parenting education will be offered. The pregnant student's parents/guardians will be strongly encouraged to participate in this program. There will be no cost to the student or her parents/guardians.

Administrative Regulation for Pregnancy – Male

1. Fathering a child is not a condition that constitutes exclusion or expulsion.
2. When school personnel are informed that a student has fathered a child, designated personnel shall meet with the student and his parents/guardians to inform them of the information given to them indicating that the student has fathered a child.
3. School personnel will inform the student and his parents/guardians of the services that are available within the local community for medical and neonatal care.
4. The school superintendent and/or principal will review the student's schedule and discuss what adjustments need to be made to enable the student to continue his educational plan. Participation in school-sponsored activities shall be determined on a case-by-case basis by the superintendent and/or principal.
5. The student who fathered a child is expected to exercise appropriate discretion regarding the pregnancy in relationship to other members of the student body.
6. Children born of a male student are not to be brought to the campus during the school hours, or other school sponsored events without the permission of the superintendent and/or principal.
7. Students known to have fathered a child will be required to participate in counseling services through Catholic Charities in LaSalle, IL or other equivalent programs as approved by the superintendent and/or principal. These programs will provide pregnancy-planning services including referrals to WIC/Public Aid, Medicare, and other supportive services available in the community. The options of parenting and open adoption will be explored, and parenting education will be offered. The parents/guardians of the student who fathered a child will be strongly encouraged to participate in this program. There will be no cost to the student or his parents/guardians.

XXV. STUDENT SERVICES

Guidance and counseling are available to students in many ways, both formal and informal. The four basic functions of the guidance program include: Information Services, Counseling Services, Psychological Services and Testing Services.

A. SCHOOL COUNSELOR

Formally, guidance and counseling are done by the School Counselor. The School Counselor is responsible for college and career guidance. He/she also gives personal counseling to students.

The department philosophy is consistent with the school's mission: prepare students for college and for life by welcoming them into a community of learning permeated by Christian values. The counseling department does this by helping students embrace their individuality, challenge their assumptions, grow in confidence academically and personally, while developing self-knowledge. To accomplish this, the counseling department provides the following services for its students:

- Individual/personal counseling – meeting student's social/emotional needs and helping them set and meet personal goals
- Career/College search and selection – step-by-step guidance using online College & Career search programs.
- Academic guidance – providing advice and proven techniques to assist in our student's academic development.
- Group guidance programs – delivery of important Counseling Department curriculum to larger student groups.
- Parent programs and seminars – aimed at providing families with the most current and critical information to help with the high school years and college search and selection process.
 - Freshman Parent Info Night
 - College Planning Night for Junior & Senior Students and their Parents
 - FAFSA Completion Workshop

B. CAMPUS MINISTRY

Adolescents facing a variety of issues related to their maturation and development or issues that present themselves from society, often have a need for counseling and spiritual direction. The Chaplain, as a sounding board for the students, helps identify areas of concern for individual students and for the whole school community. By listening to students and their concerns, the Chaplain is able to find areas where perhaps a faculty member may become a minister to someone in need.

C. BRUIN LEARNING CENTER

The Saint Bede Academy Bruin Learning Center, located on the second floor in room 225, provides academic support and tutorial services to all students in all subject areas while equipping them with the skills needed to be successful, independent, life-long learners.

The Tutoring Center is staffed with a full-time tutor and peer tutors.

- Full-time tutor: Monday – Friday from 7:50 a.m. – 2:40 p.m. during a student's study hall period.
- Peer tutoring: Monday & Wednesday from 2:45 p.m. – 3:30 p.m.

There are two types of services provided by the Tutoring Center:

- Drop-Ins: The Bruin Learning Center is available for students to drop in with questions in any subject area at any level. Services include writing revisions, test preparation, and concept review. When students drop in, they should come prepared with specific questions/topics to discuss.
- Referrals: Prior to accessing the services of the Bruin Learning Center for an extended period of time, students are first required to meet with their classroom teacher(s). The classroom teacher(s) can address and resolve most student-learning problems. If additional academic support above and beyond those provided by the classroom teacher becomes necessary, the teacher will submit a formal referral to the Bruin Learning Center. This referral leads to the development of a comprehensive, coordinated, and well-communicated plan of action involving the student, the classroom teacher, the parents, and the staff in the Bruin Learning Center.

XXVI. POLICY RELATIVE TO MARRIAGE

Students enrolled at Saint Bede Academy are expected to be unmarried. Every effort shall be made to meet the welfare and needs of all prospective students and to take into account the educational needs and welfare of the other Academy students. Enrollment shall be determined on a case by case basis by the superintendent and/or the principal. A student who enters into a marriage may continue to be enrolled at Saint Bede Academy as determined on a case by case basis by the superintendent and/or the principal.

XXVII. HEALTH CARE

A. FIRST AID

Any student who is ill or injured in school should report to the main office.

B. HEALTH EXAMINATIONS, PARENTAL MEDICAL RELEASE, STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE & LIABILITY WAIVER

In accordance with the Illinois Department of Public Health, a student shall show appropriate evidence of a health examination prior to being admitted into the ninth grade. Students participating in athletics must have a yearly physical form on file in the school office. Parents are to sign an emergency medical treatment for every minor child authorization and a student accident insurance and liability waiver, supplied by the Academy school office. Students enrolling for the first time in an Illinois school must show proof of an eye examination.

C. IMMUNIZATION

In compliance with the requirements of the State of Illinois, students must present proof of having received the immunizations against preventable communicable diseases as required by the rules and regulations of the Illinois Department of Public Health. A complete immunization record for all students entering Saint Bede must be on file in the school office before October 15th of any given year or the student will be excluded from school until the requirement is met. Students enrolling after the first day of school must present proof of their completed immunization record and their health examination upon entering the Academy.

D. MEDICATION

If a doctor determines that a child must take medication during school hours and the parents wish to come to school to administer the medication, they may do so. If, however, they wish the school personnel to supervise the child's taking any medicine, the following rules must be followed:

1. A written order must be provided to the school from the doctor, giving the name of the medication, the dosage and the time it is to be taken.
2. A written request from the parents authorizing the administering of any prescribed medication at school must be given.
3. The medication must be brought to school in a container appropriately labeled by the druggist or pharmacy.
4. Only enough medication shall be sent to school for a given week. The container is to be taken home on Friday or the last day of school for that week.

The school will provide safe storage for the prescribed medicines and will keep a basic record of any drug administered.

E. SELF ADMINISTRATION ASTHMA MEDICATION AND/OR EPINEPHRINE AUTO INJECTORS

Saint Bede Academy students may possess an epinephrine auto-injector (EpiPen®) and/or medication prescribed for asthma or diabetes for immediate use at the student's discretion, provided the student's parent/guardian has completed and signed a "Saint Bede Academy Medication Supervision Request Form. Saint Bede Academy shall incur no liability, except for willful and wanton conduct, as a result of any injury arising from a student's self-administration of medication or epinephrine auto-injector.

F. STUDENT WELLNESS PLAN

Saint Bede Academy shall be committed to providing a learning environment that supports and promotes wellness, good nutrition, and an active lifestyle and recognizes the positive relationship between good nutrition, physical activity, and the capacity of students to develop and learn. The entire school environment shall be aligned with healthy school goals to positively influence students' beliefs and habits and promote health and wellness, good nutrition, and regular physical activity. In addition, school staff shall be encouraged to model healthy eating and physical activity as a valuable part of daily life. It is the policy of Saint Bede Academy that:

1. The Academy will provide nutrition education and physical education to foster lifelong habits of healthy eating and physical activity and reduce childhood obesity.
2. All students will have opportunities, support, and encouragement to participate in physical activities on a regular basis.
3. Qualified food service providers will provide students with access to a variety of affordable, nutritious, and appealing foods that meet the health and nutrition needs of the students; will accommodate the religious requirements of the students; and will provide clean, safe, and pleasant settings and adequate time for the students to eat.
4. Foods and beverages sold and/or served as part of the school meal programs will meet the nutrition recommendations of the U.S. Dietary Guidelines for Americans.
5. Saint Bede Academy will engage students, parents, teachers, food service providers, health professionals, and interested community members in monitoring and reviewing the implementation of the Student Wellness Plan.

XXVIII. POLICY ON H.I.V. AND A.I.D.S.

- A. Saint Bede Academy's approach to H. I. V. (Human Immunodeficiency Virus) and A. I. D. S. (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome) and to persons with this disease will be in harmony with the moral and social teachings of Jesus Christ as interpreted and taught by the Roman Catholic Church and with current scientific information and accepted medical practice.
- B. An education program on the H. I. V./A. I. D. S. disease will be provided for use at the Academy.
- C. Persons identified as being H. I. V. infected, applying for seeking admission to Saint Bede Academy will not be discriminated against on the basis of H. I. V. infection diagnosis.
- D. Precaution will be taken to protect the confidentiality of records, files and other information about the H. I. V. status of students, applicants and employees of Saint Bede Academy. Persons deemed to have a direct need to know would be provided with the appropriate information. These persons, however, will not further disclose such information.

XXIX. EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

A. ACTIVITIES OFFERED

The Academy offers the following extra-curricular activities:

Academic Challenge (WYSE) Team, Drama, Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, Heritage Club, Musical Theater, Newspaper, Prom Committee, Pep Club, SBA Student Government, Scholastic Bowl Team, Soccer Club, Stage Crew, Ambassador Team, Caedmon, and Yearbook Staff.

The Academy offers the following athletic activities:

Fall: Girls Cheerleading; Boys/Girls Cross Country; Boys Football; Boys/Girls Golf; Girls Tennis; Girls Volleyball.

Winter: Boys/Girls Basketball; Boys/Girls Bowling; Girls Cheerleading; Wrestling.

Spring: Boys Baseball; Girls Softball; Boys Tennis; Boys/Girls Track and Field.

B. POLICY ON ALL EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

All athletic and other extracurricular programs have rules and regulations concerning violations of school policy. Students must be passing six subjects when enrolled in seven Saint Bede Academy classes and five subjects when enrolled in an E²C class during any week that the Eligibility Verification or report cards are issued. If he or she is academically ineligible, they will be suspended for one week of activities or athletics events beginning immediately and ending on the following Monday. The student will attend meetings, rehearsals and/or practices. **If a student is ineligible for three consecutive weeks as determined by the weekly Eligibility Verification the student will be removed from the team.** If a student is suspended for violation of school rules and regulations, he or she will be suspended for a one-week period of activities or athletic events for each day of suspension. The student will not participate in practice on days they are suspended. Students must be in attendance for a full school day to participate in practice or events unless excused by administration. Students must be in attendance for four class periods to attend practice or events.

C. ALL REQUIRED PAPERWORK, REGISTRATION INFORMATION, AND FEES MUST BE ON FILE WITH THE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR PRIOR TO ANY PARTICIPATION.

This summary is for the purpose of assisting in the understanding of IHSA By-laws and Policies. In case of a conflict between this publication and the constitution and by-laws of the IHSA, the constitution and by-laws shall control.

Key Provisions Regarding IHSA Rules

Eligibility Rules

When you become a member of an interscholastic team at your high school, you will find that both your school and the IHSA will have rules you must follow to be eligible for interscholastic participation. The IHSA's rules have been adopted by the high schools which are members of IHSA as part of the Association's constitution and by-laws. They must be followed as minimum standards for all interscholastic athletic competition in any member high school. Your high school may have additional requirements, but they may not be less stringent than these statewide minimums.

The principal/official representative of your school is responsible to see that only eligible students represent the school in interscholastic competition. Any question concerning your eligibility should be referred to your principal/official representative, who has a complete copy of all IHSA eligibility rules, including the Association's due process procedure. Only the IHSA Executive Director is authorized to make formal rulings on eligibility, so if your principal/official representative has questions or wishes assistance in answering your questions, the principal/official representative should contact the IHSA Office.

Information contained here highlights some of the most important features of the IHSA by-laws regarding interscholastic eligibility. It is designed to make you aware of major requirements you must meet to be eligible to compete in interscholastic competition. The information here is only a general description of major by-law provisions and does not contain the statement of the by-laws in their entirety. You can review the by-laws at www.ihsa.org.

You may lose eligibility for interscholastic competition if you are not in compliance with IHSA by-laws. Remember, if you have any questions regarding IHSA rules, please contact your principal/official representative.

1. Attendance

- A. You may represent only the school you attend. Participation on a cooperative team of which your school is a member is acceptable.

- B. You must be enrolled and attending classes in your high school no later than the beginning of the 11th school day of the semester.
- C. If you attend school for ten (10) or more days during any one semester, it will count as one of the eight (8) **consecutive** semesters of high school attendance during which you may possibly have eligibility.
- D. If you have a lapse in school connection for ten (10) or more consecutive school days during a semester, you are subject to ineligibility for the rest of the semester. The specific terms of your extended absence must be reviewed by the Executive Director to determine if it is "lapse in school connection" or not.

2. Scholastic Standing

- A. You must pass twenty-five (25) credit hours of high school work per week. Generally, twenty-five (25) credit hours is the equivalent of five (5) .5 credit courses (2.5 full credits).
- B. You must have passed and received credit toward graduation for twenty-five (25) credit hours of high school work for the entire previous semester to be eligible at all during the ensuing semester.

3. Residence

Your eligibility is dependent on the location of the residence where you live full time with your parents, parent who has been assigned custody by the court, or court appointed legal guardian. You may be eligible if you are entering high school as a freshman and:

- A. You attend the public high school in the district in which you live full time with both of your parents, custodial parent or court appointed guardian; or
- B. In the case of a multiple school district, you attend the public high school in the attendance area where you live full time with your parents, custodial parent or court appointed guardian; or
- C. You have paid tuition to attend a public school for a minimum of 7th and 8th grades in a district other than the one where you live with your parents, custodial parent or court appointed guardian and you continue to pay tuition as a high school student in that same district; or
- D. You attend a private/parochial school located within the boundaries of the public school district where you live with your parents, custodial parent or court appointed guardian; or
- E. You attend a private/parochial high school and have attended a private/parochial school for 7th and 8th grades, or for any four (4) grades from kindergarten through eighth grades; or
- F. You attend the private/parochial high school which one or both of your parents attended; or

- G. You attend a private/parochial high school located within a thirty (30) mile radius of the residence where you live with your parents, custodial parent or court appointed guardian.

4. Transfer

- A. In all transfer cases, both the principal of the school from which you transfer and the principal of the school into which you transfer must concur with the transfer in writing on a form provided by the IHSA Office. **You cannot be eligible when you transfer until this form is fully executed and on file in the school office.**
- B. If you transfer after classes begin for the current school term, you will definitely be ineligible for thirty days from the date you start attending classes at the new high school. In addition, you will be ineligible for that entire school term in any sport in which you engaged in any team activity, including but not limited to tryouts, drills, physical practice sessions, team meetings, playing in a contest, etc. at the school from which you transferred. For example, if you were out for cross country at the school from which you transfer and transfer after **the IHSA sport season has begun**, you will be ineligible for cross country that entire school term at the new school.
- C. If you transfer attendance from one high school to another high school, you will be ineligible unless:
 1. Your transfer is in conjunction with a change in residence by both you and your parents, custodial parent or court appointed guardian from one public school district to a different public school district;
 2. Your transfer is between high schools within a public school district and both you and your parents, custodial parent or court appointed guardian change residence to the district attendance area for the school to which you transfer;
 3. Your parents are divorced or legally separated; you transfer to a new school in conjunction with a modification or other change in legal custody between your parents by action of a judge; and required court documents are on file at the school into which you transfer;
- D. If you transfer in conjunction with a change in legal guardianship, a ruling on your eligibility must be obtained from the IHSA Office.
- E. If you transfer attendance from one school to another while you are ineligible for any reason, the period of ineligibility imposed prior to your transfer or the period of ineligibility that would have been imposed had you stayed at the school, will be enforced at the school to which you transfer, even if you are otherwise in compliance with the by-laws.

- F. Any questions about your eligibility in any of these instances must be resolved by a formal ruling from the IHSA Executive Director.
- G. In all other transfer situations, a ruling by the IHSA Executive Director is necessary to determine your eligibility. This ruling must be obtained in writing by the principal/official representative of the school into which you transfer before you participate in an interscholastic athletic contest.
- H. The IHSA Executive Director may grant limited eligibility if you transfer schools prior to the start of your **junior** year and are not otherwise in compliance with the transfer eligibility by-laws.

5. Age

You will become ineligible on the date you become twenty (20) years of age, unless your twentieth (20th) birthday occurs during a sport season. In that case, you will become ineligible regarding age at the beginning of the sport season during which your twentieth (20th) birthday occurs.

6. Physical Examination

You must have placed on file with your principal/official representative a certificate of physical fitness, signed by a licensed physician, physician’s assistant, or nurse practitioner to practice or participate. Your physical examination is good for 395 days from the date of the exam. The physician’s report must be on file with your high school principal/official representative.

7. Amateur Status and Name, Image, and Likeness (NIL)

- A. If you win or place in actual competition, you may accept a medal or trophy for that accomplishment, without limit to its cost. Your school may provide IHSA state champions with championship rings/mementoes **not to exceed \$300**.
- B. For participating in competition in an interscholastic sport, you may receive any type of award (except cash, check, or legal tender) that does not exceed **\$150** in fair market value. There is no limitation on the value of your school letter.
- C. The amateur rule does not prohibit you from being paid to referee, receiving pay for teaching lessons or coaching in a little kid’s league, etc. It only applies to your own competition in an athletic contest.
- D. If you violate the amateur rule, you become ineligible in the sport in which you violate. You must be reinstated by the Executive Director before you may compete again.

E. IHSA By-laws and Board Policies provide guidance and restrictions to when and how you might capitalize on your name, image, and likeness (NIL). Work closely with your

principal/official representative on opportunities that come your way.

8. Recruiting of Athletes

- A. The by-laws prohibit recruiting of high school students for athletics. If you are solicited to enroll in or transfer to a school to participate in athletics, you are being illegally recruited and your eligibility is in jeopardy.
- B. You will lose your eligibility if you enroll in or transfer to a school in response to recruiting efforts by any person or group of persons, connected with, or not connected with the school, related to athletic participation.
- C. You will lose your eligibility if you receive special benefits or privileges as a prospective student-athlete which are not uniformly made available to all students who attend your school.
- D. You may not receive an “athletic scholarship” or any other special benefit from your school because you participate in athletics.
- E. It is a violation for any student-athlete to receive or be offered remuneration or any special inducement which is not made available to all applicants who apply to or enroll in the school.
- F. It is also a violation to induce or attempt to induce or encourage any prospective student to attend any member school for the purpose of participating in athletics, even when special remuneration or inducement is not given. Please remember that you may not be offered or receive any benefit, service, privilege, or opportunity which is not also provided or made available to all prospective students at that school.

Note: If you are interested in finding out more information about a school, contact the principal/official representative or an administrator at the school, not a member of the coaching staff.

9. School Team Sports Seasons

- A. Each sport conducted by IHSA member schools has a starting and ending date. Your school may not organize a team, begin practice or participate in contests in a given sport until the authorized starting date. Your school may not continue to practice or participate in contests after the authorized ending date. This means that:
 - 1. During the school year, you may not participate on a non-school team coached by any member of your school’s coaching staff unless it meets specific criteria established by the by-laws.
 - 2. No school coach may require you to participate in an out-of-season sport program as a requirement for being a member of a school team.
- B. Violation of the sport season by-laws will result in penalty to you and/or to your school’s coaching personnel.

10. Playing in Non-School Competition

- A. During the time you are participating on a school team in a sport at your high school, you may neither play on a non-school team nor compete in non-school competition as an individual in that same sport or in any skill of that sport.
- B. If you participate in non-school competition during a sport season and subsequently wish to join the school team in the same sport, you will not be eligible.
- C. If you wish to participate in a competition sanctioned by the National Governing Body of a sport, a junior affiliate of the National Governing Body of a sport or an official Illinois affiliate for the sport, your principal/official representative must request approval through the Schools Center prior to any such participation.
- D. You may try out for a non-school team while you are on your school’s team in that same sport, but you may not practice, receive instruction, participate in workouts, or participate in competition with a non-school team in that same sport until you cease being a member of your school’s team. You cease being a member of your school’s team when the team(s) of which you are a member terminates for the school term.
- E. You will become ineligible if you participate on, practice with, or compete against any junior college, college, or university team during your high school career.

11. All-Star Participation

- A. After you have completed your high school eligibility in the sport of football, basketball, soccer, or volleyball, you may participate in three (3) all-star contests in any of these sports and still play for other school teams, provided the high school season in that sport has been completed. You may lose your eligibility for other interscholastic sports if you play in all-star competition in any of these sports under any other conditions.
- B. You are not restricted from participating in all-star competition in sports other than football, basketball, soccer, or volleyball, except that you may not do so during the school season for the sport.

12. Misbehavior During Contests

- A. If you violate the ethics of competition or the principles of good sportsmanship, you may be barred from interscholastic athletic contests, either as a participant or spectator or both.
- B. If you are ejected from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct, you will be ineligible for your team’s next contest. You are also subject to other penalties.

XXXI. FIELD TRIPS

Field trips are privileges afforded to students; no student has an absolute right to a field trip. Students can be denied participation if they fail to meet academic or behavior requirements. A student who wishes to participate in a field trip must submit a permission form signed by the parents before the field trip is to occur. (See copy of form in the appendix).

If a student does not submit the proper form, he or she will not be allowed to participate in the field trip. Telephone calls from parents will not be accepted in lieu of the proper form. Parents also have the right to refuse to allow their child to participate in a field trip.

XXXII. USE OF SCHOOL GROUNDS

All Abbey and Academy grounds are restricted areas. Students are not to enter any of the Abbey or Academy grounds without teacher or adult supervision. Students that arrive before 7:30am to school must report directly to the PSC Commons. The entire Academy becomes a restricted area after 4:00 p.m. until 7:00 a.m. the next day, except for scheduled practices, rehearsals, meetings or extra-curricular activities with adult supervision. Students involved in such activities are to leave the Academy grounds immediately afterwards. The main building and gym will be locked at 4:00 p.m.

Anyone wishing to use the Academy grounds or facilities must contact the Business Manager for permission. All arrangements must be made through them. Anyone wishing to use the Abbey Church must contact the building's coordinator. All arrangements must be made through him. Students are not to use the Abbey grounds at any time except in the presence of a member of Saint Bede Abbey. At no time may students enter the monastery building unless accompanied by a member of Saint Bede Abbey.

XXXIII. CRISIS PLANS

A. FIRE DRILL

Directions to be followed when a fire alarm sounds are posted in each classroom and in various locations throughout the building. The designated exits for getting out of the school building are posted in each classroom. Students are to follow them. When a fire alarm sounds:

1. Teachers are the last ones to leave the classroom, making sure that all lights are off, all windows and doors are closed and all students are out. (Teachers are to take their class rosters with them.)
2. Teachers are to accompany their students out of the building to the designated area. Students will proceed in an orderly, quiet manner so that further instructions, if necessary, can be heard.
3. Teachers will take roll when they reach their area and report the names of any missing students to the designated person immediately.
4. The Superintendent and Principal will be the last persons to leave the building and will proceed to the front of the school.
5. All will wait for instructions to return into the building.

B. TORNADO DRILL

The basement of the school, extending south from outside the chemistry room, through the tunnel to the gym basement, lining up in the corridors to the girls and boys locker rooms are designated as shelter areas. Classes meeting in the basement are to go through the tunnel to the gym basement. Classes meeting on the first floor are to move down the stairs by the washroom to the basement and fill in. Classes meeting on the second floor are to move to the main stairway to the basement and fill in. The tornado drill procedure is:

1. An alarm, three short blasts of the fire alarm, will be sounded.
2. Teachers will instruct the students where to go, leave the windows open six (6) inches, turn off the lights, close the doors and escort the students to the shelter areas.
3. One line is to be formed on each side of the corridors and lockers in the shelter areas, leaving the center open for a walkway.
4. All will face the walls or lockers. No one should stand in front of doors or windows.
5. The drill will be executed in silence.
6. A signal will be given when the drill is over.

The Saint Bede Academy Board of Directors retains the right to amend this handbook. Parents will be given prompt notification of any changes that are made.

XXXVI. ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT PLAN

In accordance with federal and state guidelines, Saint Bede Academy has been inspected for friable and non-friable asbestos. Saint Bede Academy has a management plan available in the Business office for your review. In accordance with the guidelines, Saint Bede Academy will also have six-month and three year re-inspections. Saint Bede Academy will carry out its response action in accordance with federal and state laws and guidelines. Repair, removal or cleanup will be taken care of in accordance with these laws and guidelines, as funds become available.
