





St. Bede Auction breaks multiple records

Thanks to our amazing St. Bede family, the auction broke records this year! Starting out with 342 guests in attendance, and 125 new attendees, the auction was a sellout! Most impressive was the representation of 42 classes of alumni beginning with the Class of 1949 up to the Class of 2015 including 11 classes of Golden Bedans. The return of mobile bidding was a great success bringing in \$27,000 and breaking last year's silent auction totals with bids from St. Bede supporters all over the country. Mobile bidding generated over \$12,000 before the night even started.

The live auction kicked off with a tribute to 94-year-old Brother George Matsuoka. In honor of our 125th anniversary, we honored our eldest monk by naming a Teddy Bear after him, as our 2016 Auction Signature Item. "George", was sponsored by our Platinum Sponsor, Geneva International. Forty Teddy Bears were auctioned off to the guests after a slide show showing pictures of Brother George was shown and junior, Harleigh Rice sang "Unforgettable."

The evening added even more excitement with a generous match from Mr. Jerry Rich for the Live Auction donation of the Rich Harvest Farms Weekend. The exclusive golf weekend donation was sold three times and brought in a total of \$30,000 with final bids of \$10,000 each. Those winning bids were then matched generously by Mr. Rich.

The auction continued on with more momentum when our students emerged to Fund-A-Need for "Project Lead the Way". Leading off with paddles raised for two gifts of \$10,000, the St. Bede family showed their strong support for technology again this year by raising \$60,380 to fund the implementation of adding computer science classes to the St. Bede curriculum in the fall. This exceeded our goal by \$10,380. "The generosity from our St. Bede family is what makes it possible to keep our tuition affordable and offer a Catholic education to young people in the Illinois Valley," stated Abbot Philip Davey, O.S.B.

An all-time record year of \$275,000 was set for our Special Events and the Auction Gala, exceeding last year's total of \$223,830.

Each year the Auction raises money to help offset the cost of tuition for each and every St. Bede student. Over a third of the students and over 100 volunteers assisted with our largest fundraiser. Thank you to all our volunteers, without you, the night wouldn't be possible.



With God's blessing and the support of the St. Bede community, when you read *The Bedan Record* at this time next year we will have started construction on a new era of academic excellence for St. Bede Academy. The next steps of

the Legacy Project are clear and exciting. Teams of talented alumni, staff and supporters have worked diligently over the past several months to prioritize our needs and design facilities that function well and look great. More work remains of course and fundraising efforts are ramping-up. The Project phases are described below. Each phase seeks to complement our existing architectural style and will take about 12 to 15 months to complete, which allows enough time to thoughtfully design and fund the projects.

Sciences Wing, 2017-2018

Construction of the Sciences wing is expected to start in April 2017. The addition will be on the north end of our school and will take advantage of the new arch. Innovative laboratories for Biology, Chemistry and Physics will dominate the space. The new facilities will greatly support our increasingly challenging Sciences curriculum. A Welcome Commons is planned to greet students, staff and guests to our campus. The Commons will offer spaces to collaborate, congregate or to simply contemplate.

Field House, 2018-2019

The Field House will be a versatile venue for our many sports teams and clubs. In addition to the obvious athletics gains, it offers an academic benefit as well because student-athletes will no longer have to wait hours to start practice. The Field House will have three basketball courts and a track encircling those playing surfaces. The courts can be modified for



#GIVINGTUESDAY raised \$65,000 for the St. Bede Fund #BRUINPRIDE Challenge surpassed with matching gifts of \$31,500

On December 1, St. Bede kicked off their first year of participation in #GIVINGTUESDAY. The Development Department set forth a #BRUINPRIDE Challenge for the Annual Fund to reach a goal of \$12,500 in one day in honor of our 125th Anniversary. With the support of four matching donors, D.J. Sickley Construction '73, Angelo Perino '80, both with matching gifts of \$5,000 each, LaSalle State Bank with a match of \$1,500 and an anonymous \$1,000 donor our challenge quickly reached our goal by late morning. By noon, the challenge grew to \$27,500 with a gift of \$5,000 from David Porter '61 and \$10,000 from an anonymous supporter. "This is exciting and I want to be involved." stated one of the donors.

Donations were primarily received online but also included a few personal visits to St. Bede eager to see how the day was progressing and excited to be involved. By 8:00 p.m. the #BRUINSPRIDE Challenge had surpassed its goal and had reached over \$28,000. However, the day wasn't over yet. A final matching gift challenge of \$4,000 was received just prior to the Boys Varsity basketball game setting the final goal to reach by midnight at \$31,500. And achieved it was. On #GIVINGTUESDAY, friends and family of St. Bede raised over \$34,000 and with matches of \$31,500 brought the grand total to over \$65,000 in one day to support the St. Bede Annual Fund. WOW!

WWII Veteran From The Class of 1943 Receives His Diploma 73 Years Later

This spring, Superintendent Dr. Ted Struck received an email from Jean Callaghan McQuillan, the daughter of former Bruin, Francis J. Callaghan. She explained how her father had to leave the Academy after being recruited into the military and now requested help in obtaining his diploma. The 91-year-old did not graduate with his St. Bede classmates back in the spring of 1943. Instead of finishing out his senior year, he was recruited to serve his country on July 5, 1943. Francis was stationed in the Philippines under the 530th Army of Engineers.

Past transcripts and documents from St. Bede and two other sources verified that Francis attended St. Bede from 1942-1943, did not graduate and was missing his lab science requirement. However, it was discovered that Francis had accrued 17.5 high school credits when graduation requirements in 1943 were only 16 high school credits. The lab science requirement was waived and a diploma was promptly issued to Mr. Callaghan. Francis and his family were invited to join the graduating Class of 2016 to participate in the 124th Commencement ceremony and be awarded his St. Bede diploma in person. Due to unforeseen circumstances, Mr. Callaghan was unable to travel and received his diploma by mail. We look forward to a visit from Francis in the near future as an alum and member of the graduating class of 1943.

1967 St. Bede Alum Reconnected with Lost Class Ring



Last fall, our Development Department received a phone call from a woman in Ohio who was hoping we could help her find the owner of a 1967 St. Bede Academy class ring. The caller revealed while out walking her dog, she happened to look down and see a shiny class ring. She picked it up, looked it over and discovered it to be a 1967 St. Bede Academy high school ring. Inside the ring were

the engraved initials, M.A.K. The caller reached out to the St. Bede Development Department to inquire if we could help find the graduate of the missing ring. The ring was then mailed to us so we could reconnect our alum with his class ring.

After identifying the only 1967 graduate with the initials M.A.K, we contacted a relative who was also a graduate of St. Bede. The relative, after hearing the "found ring" story, gave us a cell number to call. We were thrilled to reach our 1967 alum, Michael Kopina to let him know the good news; that his St. Bede class ring had been found in Ohio. Mike made the trip to St. Bede to be reunited with his ring. Interestingly enough, Mike, a resident of Illinois, had never been to Ohio, and had been missing his ring for many years.

The lost 1967 ring had finally found its home. Mike is looking forward to coming back to St. Bede in 2017 to celebrate his 50th Reunion.

Bauer continued, "Greeting and congratulating the seniors in the line after Mass was a real highlight to the day."

The Class of 1966 spent the remainder of the afternoon discussing homecoming plans and their special class gift, to fund a new website for St. Bede that will launch this summer.

Terrence Bosshart, who made the trip from Michigan state, "I felt proud to be a Bruin again, as did the other old guys from my class. We did a lot of reminiscing, resulting in a great time. I hope future classes, especially the Class of 2016, enjoy their time to be Golden Bedans fifty years from now."



Alumnus Award

The Alumni Association introduces St. Bede Academy Distinguished Alumnus Award

Each year, beginning in 2017, the SBA Alumni Association will recognize an individual and honor an alumnus for significant professional and personal achievements. These individuals will have attended or graduated from St. Bede Academy and must best exemplify our ideals and values. The recipients should serve as a role models for current and future St. Bede Academy students.

CRITERIA FOR SELECTION:

Nominee must have attended or graduated from St. Bede Academy at least 20 years prior to the nomination.

Nominee has achieved a high level of success in one or more of the following:

- As a professional in their chosen field career field like business, education, engineering, law, medicine, military service, science, social work and many other professions.
- As a volunteer to a non-for profit, charity, faith-based organization, church or other form of social and philanthropic outreach.
- As a mentor providing support to the youth of their community.
- As an alumni, parent or friend who provides outstanding service to St. Bede Academy.

Nominee is expected to attend the Auction and meet with current SBA students at a school function (date TBD) prior to the presentation.

SELECTION PROCESS:

Nominations are to be submitted to the Selection Committee by no later than January 1 of each year. See the attached form which is an example of what the nomination form will look like.

Nominations can be made by St. Bede Alumni, their parents or spouses, current, past, and retired faculty and staff of St. Bede Academy and Abbey and friends of the school.

A six member selection committee (made up of the Abbot, the school Superintendent, the president of the St. Bede Academy Board, the president of the Alumni Association and two ad hoc members to be appointed each year by the Abbot) will determine the award winner(s) from the nominations submitted.

The selection committee will protect the confidentiality of the nominees during their deliberations and while the nominee is on file for possible consideration.

The selection of an individual for this award must be by a unanimous vote of the selection committee. Individuals not selected for the award on their initial nomination will have their nomination reviewed yearly for two additional award cycles.

Members of the selection committee cannot be a nominee nor can they make a nomination during their tenure on the committee.

There is no requirement that the selection committee make an award each year.

The number of awards each year can be zero to a maximum of three awards.

The award winner(s) will be notified and their selection announced at least two month prior to the presentation.

The 2017 award winner(s) will be honored and recognized on Saturday, April 29, 2017 at the St. Bede Auction. In years to follow the award winner will be recognized at the St. Bede Auction.



Br. Anthony (Patrick) Shaughnessy, O.S.B.



In the late afternoon of the feast of St. Benedict on July 11, 2015, Br. Anthony (Patrick) Shaughnessy, O.S.B., died peacefully at St. Joseph Nursing Home in Lacon, Illinois. He was 84.

The youngest of six children, Br. Anthony was born on March 6, 1931, in Birmingham, Michigan to William C. and Agnes Shaughnessy, and was baptized under the patronage of St. Patrick. He attended

Saint Mary's High School in Royal Oak, Michigan, where he played center and nose guard for the football team. It was there that he met his future wife, Margaret Anne Gignac who was a cheerleader. They were married in 1952. He graduated with a degree in Chemical Engineering from the University of Detroit. He had a full career in management and quality control operations with several large engineering firms, working in Michigan, Wisconsin, Indiana and Kansas before moving in Davenport, Iowa where he retired. He was married for 45 years and had ten children. His wife passed away in 1997.

Though he always had a full-time job, Patrick was very active in religious studies and served in many lay capacities in his home parishes. After the death of his wife, Patrick first learned about the Benedictine way of life during a retreat, and continued his spiritual development under the guidance of Sr. Audrey Cleary, O.S.B. of St. Mary's Monastery, Rock Island. After much consideration and prayer, he sought the blessing of his ten children as he began the transition into monastic life, taking the name Anthony. He professed first vows

on February 9, 2001. His children were present as he took his final vows on July 11, 2004. His family visited St. Bede often and enjoyed coming to know their patriarch in his new role as a Benedictine monk.

Br. Anthony worked diligently at whatever task he was assigned, whether in the apple orchard, where he served for a time as operations manager, as assistant sacristan, supplies manager, or as director of abbey housekeeping, a job at which he especially excelled. He designed and built custom magazine racks for the reading room, supervised the installation of many new windows in the monastery building, and did a thorough energy study which resulted in a significant reduction in costs. Upon the death of Fr. Sebastian in 2006, he served for a time as prior and junior master.

As his health would permit, Br. Anthony continued working on various maintenance projects until July of 2014, when injuries sustained from a fall required time in a rehab center. Other injuries as well as complications arising from congestive heart failure necessitated his moving to St. Joseph's Nursing Home in Lacon, Illinois in January of 2015. His children and various community members were frequent visitors, which he appreciated and cherished. He especially enjoyed being taken into town for coffee and a piece of pie at his favorite cafe. He bore with his suffering with the assistance of staff member Sr. Michael, with whom he developed a deep spiritual bond.

Br. Anthony took great delight in researching and chronicling the genealogy of both sides of the family, a task which he continued even as his health began to fail. He left his children several volumes of family history, as well as collections of his own spiritual reflections. He even prepared one such collection in which he commented on the prayers and readings which he had selected for his funeral.

Fr. Gabriel enjoyed teaching.

Reverend Gabriel (Gary) Bullock, O.S.B. passed away on June 10, 2016, at St. Joseph's Nursing Home, Lacon, after an extended illness.

Fr. Gabriel was born March 25, 1934, the son of Roy E. and Jane Morris Bullock, in Peoria, Illinois. He attended St. Patrick's


Elementary School and was a graduate of Spalding Institute where he was alutatorian of his class. After two years at St. Bede Junior College, he entered the monastery novitiate in 1954. He took his solemn vows on July 11, 1955, and was ordained a priest on May 28, 1961. He received a B.A. in philosophy from St. John's University and a master's degree in English from the University of Notre Dame.

Fr. Gabriel served on the faculty of Saint Bede Academy as an English and Religion teacher, and as moderator of the school newspaper and the yearbook. He performed weekend pastoral ministry to many parishes in the Illinois Valley and was active in the Illinois Valley Clergy Council. He was in demand as a retreat director, and served as confessor to the Academy students even up to the 2015-2016 school year and to adults in spiritual direction.

Fr. Gabriel had the soul of an artist, which expressed itself in ways great and small, from his distinctive handwriting to his catering elaborate gourmet meals as an auction item for the Academy. He designed and built sets for several plays, including Fr. Placid Hatfield's productions of *Macbeth* and *Othello*. His marathon sessions (well-fueled by Hershey bars) for setting out the yearbook were legendary, as was his love for the *Iliad* and the *Odyssey* along with many other great works of literature.



"I was there when Fr. Gabriel was ordained and he remembered that in my brief visit with him in 2014. His way of dispensing his wisdom and guidance was always low-key. You knew he was there to turn to. We have lost a valuable mentor, and a dedicated teacher."




Back to the Future

Monasteries have long been the places where books and manuscripts are both cherished and preserved. In the 7th century, Benedict Biscop, abbot and founder of the twin monasteries at Wearmouth and Jarrow in northeastern England, traveled frequently to Europe to obtain books to stock the monastic libraries. Our patron St. Bede used that library to become a shining intellectual light for the Church.

In this tradition, the monks of St. Bede Abbey have undertaken to make their extensive monastic theology library available to modern scholars by entering all 19,000 plus volumes into a computerized database. Can you picture the spiral staircase you probably remember all too well? Although we are moving to the future with technology, the library that houses over 19,000 volumes has stood still, stated Prior Michael Calhoun, O.S.B, who is spearheading the project.

Beginning with the theology books various monks brought back from their seminary studies, the St. Bede monastic library grew into an impressive collection of books on topics ranging from theology and scripture to monastic studies and social justice in languages as diverse as Biblical Hebrew and modern Italian.

As the collection grew, so, too, did the need for reorganization, a task undertaken first by Abbot Marion when he served as librarian and continued by Abbot Claude who succeeded him. Both men were also eager to create a searchable database of the collection with the hopes of eventually sharing it online.

In 2014 Abbot Philip asked Fr. Michael to take up the task, and they enlisted the help of Sr. Rebecca Abel, O.S.B., a professional librarian and sister of St. Benedict's Abbey in Ferdinand, Indiana. After assessing the quality of the collection, Sr. Rebecca reported that it was, indeed, well worth both reorganizing and entering into an online database. The St. Bede monastic library, she noted, contains many rare volumes and collections. These include an 1897 two-volume work entitled *Concordance to the Septuagint and the other Greek versions of the Old Testament* and an 1894 three-volume work entitled *The Formation of Christendom*.

At this point, Abbot Philip approached the Oblates of St. Bede and asked for volunteers to help with the work. In the ensuing months, Sr. Rebecca, Fr. Michael and some Oblate volunteers removed all of the books—all 19,000+ volumes—from the shelves, culled duplicates, and then reshelved the volumes in a new, more efficient layout Sr. Rebecca devised. Oblate Art DeGrant, '60 and JC '62 even drove from East Moline every week to help with this part of the project.

If moving the books was the physically demanding part of the project, transferring the catalogue information from paper cards to a digital database has been the time-consuming aspect. While the books were being moved, Abbot Philip authorized the purchase of a new computer and library software Sr. Rebecca recommended. While Oblates Verna and Mary Julene Auchstetter helped put barcode stickers on every book, Sr. Rebecca taught Fr. Michael and Oblates Patti Furlan, Vicki Gensini, and Kathy Martin how to enter data into the program. In early 2015, Verna and Mary Julene began transferring the barcode numbers to cards from the master shelf list catalogue.

While Fr. Michael works on major collections and books not in the shelf list catalogue, Patti, Vicki and Kathy, using a "volunteer" feature of the software, use the shelf list cards to enter volumes into the database from their home computers. At this point the database contains almost 15,700 volumes, so the task is about 75% complete. The Reference section, including all the volumes of minutes of Vatican II, is the last big collection left.

St. Bede, himself, is surely delighted with how the monastic tradition of library building is being continued here in Peru.
